THE HIGH PRICE FOR A BOWL OF SOUP

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. The book of Obadiah is unique in several aspects. First, it is the only one chapter book in the Old Testament. Secondly, we cannot pinpoint exactly who this prophet is. Some have supposed that he is the Obadiah who hid the prophets from Jezebel (1 Kings 18:4). Or, maybe they have thought he might be the Obadiah who worked with Josiah in repairing the Temple (2 Chron. 34:12). But neither of these seems likely. There are some thirteen men in the Bible bearing this name, so we cannot know for sure. However, his prophecy seems to fit the destruction of Jerusalem by Nebuchadnezzar; therefore, he probably wrote after 587 BC, but before 583 BC. Thirdly, his prophecy is almost entirely directed against one of the enemies of Israel, the Edomites.
- 2. The name Obadiah means "servant of God." He was a prophet. His prophecy was received by way of a vision and not delivered by an angelic being.
- 3. The Edomites are descendants of Esau. He sold his birthright for a mess of pottage (boiled soup). He chose the physical over the spiritual. His descendants would continue to walk in his steps until their final destruction in the defeat of Israel by Rome in 70 AD.

- 1. The Judgment of Edom (1-8).
 - 1. The pride of thine heart hath deceived thee (3).
 - 2. If someone robs you, they leave something behind. When God is done with Edom nothing will be left (5-6, 18).
 - 3. You cannot depend on men to save you from the wrath of God.
- 2. The Reason for the Judgment (9-14).
 - 1. The charge you should not have rejoiced in Israel's fall (9-12).
 - 2. Second charge you should not have plundered Jerusalem after she fell (13).
 - 3. Third charge you set a trap to assist God's enemies (14).
- 3. The Day of the Lord Will Come (15-18).
 - 1. God's judgment will come (15).
 - 2. Your insolence will not go unnoticed (16).
 - 3. Your judgment is sealed (17-18).
- 4. Edom Inhabited by Others (19-21).
 - 1. Others will live in your mountain, Petra (19-20).
 - 2. Jesus is coming and His Kingdom will prosper (21).
