## Are You a Player or a Sitter?

Like many "old-timers" that I knew growing up, my granddad loved to play dominoes. It was a passion for him that even surpassed "Saturday Night Wrestling." Which, by the way, he thought was real! Anyway when you played dominoes with my granddad, if it took you over five seconds to make your next play he would always say, "Are you a player or a sitter?" The implication was obvious, if you don't make your move quickly enough then you were a sitter. Now, let's take this thought and make some spiritual application from it.

In the New Testament the word "work" is found 180 times. We all remember the story Jesus told of two brothers. It went like this, "**But what** think ye? A certain man had two sons; and he came to the first, and said, Son, go work to day in my vineyard. He answered and said, I will not: but afterward he repented, and went. And he came to the second, and said likewise. And he answered and said, I go, sir: and went not. Whether of them twain did the will of his father? They say unto him, The first. Jesus saith unto them, Verily I say unto you, That the publicans and the harlots go into the kingdom of God before you" (Mat. 21:28-31). Brethren there is no doubt that God wants us to be workers in His vineyard.

Now to the "sitters" in the church; when it comes time for a work day, we often find that there are a lot of "sitters" in the church. They don't show up for the work day and then they complain because something was not done the way they thought it should have been done. Well, maybe if they showed up for the work day they could have done it the way they wanted.

When it comes time for getting teachers for Bible Class, there are a lot of "sitters" in the church. How many times since you have been a Christian have you taught Bible Class? Compare that with the number of times that you have been asked and you might be shocked by the difference.

Remember that the writer Hebrews wrote, "For when for the time ye ought to be teachers..." (Hebrews 5:12). Paul is telling us that there should come a time in the life of a Christian when they become a teacher. Sadly, some never reach that level of maturity.
