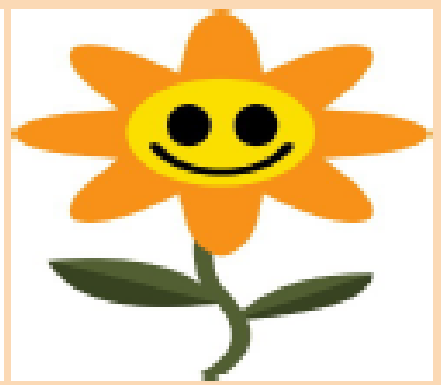


TORBANK NURSERY SCHOOL APRIL 2018 NEWSLETTER

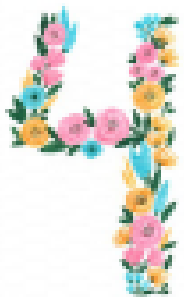

Spring is here and it is such an exciting time of year. With April we'll have warm sunny days as well as cold rainy ones, it is an exciting time to be the "weather person" at circle each morning.

April is poetry month, we will focus on poetry in its different forms. We will be reading books and poems about the changing weather and how that makes us feel. Now that the days will be warmer we will make rainbow wind socks and fly them out in the playground, as we run and enjoy the Spring.

This month we are also learning about Oviparous animals, those that hatch from eggs. This includes Birds, Amphibians, Reptiles, Insects, Fish and Mollusks. We will read and discuss all about these animals, as we will be preparing for our big event, The HATCHING CHICKS.

Our chick eggs arrive in mid April. We will keep them in an incubator in the classroom. As the days pass, we will monitor what is happening inside the eggs as we learn the stages of development that the chick goes through. It is always exciting to be a part of the process from eggs to chick. And... such a thrill to watch the chicks hatch from their eggs in early May! The children will get to spend time observing the chicks as they grow quickly, before they go off to the farm.

Our discussions of the Oviparous animals will lead the children to each choose one of the animals that they are particularly interested in and together we plan on creating that animal with paper mache'.

The children are mastering writing their names as they sign in each morning. They now recognize their names and are beginning to recognize each others names. We will continue to focus on certain letters each week and will incorporate the letter/sound into our daily activities.
