WHERE TO GET INFORMATION?

It is not too early for snow! When the next snow comes, Torbank will follow the Ossining Public School (OPS) system for closings on a snowy or icy morning. If the OPS are closed, Torbank will be closed. If the OPS are on a 2 hour delay, then Torbank will be closed. Gayle will also send an email and activate the Blackboard Connect.



WHERE TO LISTEN? You can tune your radio to WHUD (100.7 FM) to hear school

closings on a snowy or icy morning. If snow starts while school is in session, use your judgment about picking up your child. The roads/driveway can get very slippery and you may want to get your child early. As a precaution, if the roads are icy, you may not want to exit the parking lot via the normal exit. It is sometimes difficult to see oncoming cars and it may be difficult to stop. Instead, exit by the way of your usual entrance on Apple Farm Road.

WHAT TO WEAR? Winter is a wonderful time for outdoor play if your child is dressed properly. If there is snow on the ground, we recommend that children bring snow pants in their Torbank bag along with warm items: hat, mittens(no gloves please, unless your child can put them on by themselves) and boots. If your child wears boots to school, please send his/her shoes in their bag. Be sure to put your child's name on everything.
