



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN

Indonesian Pharmacists Association And

Federation of Asian Pharmaceutical Associations College of Pharmacy

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signifies the collaborative commitment between The Indonesian Pharmacists Association (IAI) and the Federation of Asian Pharmaceutical Associations College of Pharmacy (FAPA CP). The primary focus of this partnership is the establishment and successful development of FAPA CP Indonesia Chapter, with a shared commitment to advancing postgraduate training for pharmacists and fostering specialization in specific areas.

Part I: Framework for Collaborative Engagement

The scope of cooperation encompasses all aspects of postgraduate programs within FAPA CP and IAI. Both parties commit to contributing to the development of specialized training for pharmacists, promoting an environment of continuous professional growth.

In our shared commitment to excellence, both parties pledge to dedicate efforts to the following activities:

For IAI:

- 1. Establishing FAPA CP Indonesia Chapter and providing administrative and regulatory support
- 2. Engaging qualified pharmacists in the certification process
- 3. Collaborating on the development of training curricula.
- 4. Maintaining and upholding the quality assurance framework
- 5. Providing necessary financial assistance to assure the success of FAPA CP Indonesia Chapter

For FAPA CP:

- 1. Providing consultation and guidance in the establishment of FAPA CP Indonesia Chapter
- 2. Contributing to the formulation of a certification process
- 3. Collaborating on curriculum development
- 4. Sharing expertise to enhance quality of curriculum and certification processes
- 5. Establishing a collaborative consultation mechanism for smooth operation

For Both Organizations:

- 1. Establishing a joint quality assurance framework for postgraduate pharmacy training
- 2. Regularly reviewing and updating the quality assurance framework
- 3. Exploring opportunities for the reciprocal sharing of educational resources, materials, and expertise
- 4. Pursuing opportunities for networking and connections within the pharmacy community

Part III: Effective Date and Length of Agreement

This memorandum shall become effective on the date of its signature and remain in force for five years from that date. The MOU will undergo a review before the end of the five-year term and may be extended through mutual agreement between both organizations.

In the event of any questions or concerns arising during the course of this MOU, both organizations commit to consulting each other to find equitable solutions.
