

As of February 1st we were at '5' on the Growing Degrees Calendar for my zip code. February 5th we moved to '19' and today the 11th we move to '23'. The Silver Maple first bloom starts at '34'. This is the earliest food resource for the honey bees in our area. The Ohio State Phenology Calendar is found here https://www.oardc.ohio-state.edu/gdd/default.asp This resource is a valuable tool to help guide feeding decisions in our hives.

The February meeting will be brief, but valuable, as Allyson will take the first 30 minutes to answer beekeeper questions before the beginner course instruction.

All members in good standing who have previously taken the GCBA Beginners Beekeeping Course are welcome to one or all of the 2019 classes. To commemorate Earth Day 2019, the Northeast Ohio Sierra Club extends an invitation to attend the enlightening program, "Next Silent Spring?" This free event will be held at the Cleveland Museum of Art Recital Hall on Sunday, April 28, from 2 - 4 PM.

Laurel Hopwood, Senior Advisor to Sierra Club's Pollinator Protection Program, will show the outstanding documentary *"Nicotine Bees."*

Pollinator populations are declining. How does this affect our food supply? How does this affect our entire ecosystem? A panel of experts will discuss how everyone can help move things forward.

Our lending library is open before each meeting with resources for any member to borrow. If you have any gently used beekeeping or pollinator plant books you would like to donate talk to one of our librarians.

Field Day is shaping up to be a super event. Stephanie Sadlon is our Field Day Chair. She will be looking for volunteers to assist with many planning and event execution activities. Please, consider helping out.

What is happening in your hive?

With all these warmer days you should have popped open the cover to take a peek. All the early winter mild temperatures stimulated more than normal hive activity and thus food consumption. Do your bees have enough food? If not, what are you doing to get them resources? The queen is laying eggs. What does your bottom board slider look like? Varroa mites? You may consider an oxalic acid vaporization treatment if temperatures are above 40 degrees.

Many of our members received donated **milkweed seeds** a couple months ago. Now is the time to start thinking about how to prepare the seeds for the most successful germination rates and plan where you will prepare your planting area.

Early nucleus colonies will contain queens from the south or west. Local queen production is weather dependent and may not be available until late May or June.

If you purchase an early nuc you can choose to re-queen with a local queen later in the season. This is also true for a package bee installation.

Recipe of the Month

DIY Honey Nut Puffed Cereal YIELD: Makes about 2.5 quarts of cereal clusters

INGREDIENTS

4 1/2 cups puffed rice 1/4 cup light brown sugar, lightly packed

1 cup sliced almonds 2 T + 1 tsp. (32g) unsalted butter

1 1/4 tsp. ground turmeric 1/3 cup honey

1/2 tsp. cinnamon 1/2 tsp. baking soda

1/3 tsp. kosher salt 1 T aw sesame seeds

DIRECTIONS

Heat the oven to 325°F.

Line a rimmed baking sheet with parchment and set aside.

In a large heatproof bowl, combine the puffed rice, almonds, turmeric, cinnamon and salt.

In a small pot, stirring occasionally, heat the brown sugar, butter and honey, until they have been simmering in slow, steady large bubbles for 1 - 2 minutes (roughly 250°F).

Remove from heat and whisk in the baking soda. Immediately pour the mixture over the dry ingredients. Stir well with a wood spoon, making sure to mix in all the spices and seeds that have fallen to the bottom of the bowl, and then spread the mixture on the prepared baking sheet.

Bake for 15 minutes, stirring halfway through. Allow to cool completely at room temperature. Break the pieces and place into an airtight container to store.

Serve with your milk of choice, which will become "Golden Milk" when mixed with the cereal!

Instead of puffed rice, you can substitute other puffed grains like millet.
