Virtual reality technology transforming patient care

Thanks to our supporters we have recently funded four new VR headsets for Riverbank Children's Ward.

VR headsets provide a fully immersive experience for children and are proving invaluable at calming and distracting our youngest patients. The headsets are particularly beneficial for patients with needle phobia or who need to undergo an uncomfortable treatment.

Due to the immersive nature of the headsets it allows patients to relax and disassociate from the procedure itself. This provides a much more comfortable experience and in many cases speeds up the procedure.

One remarkable story saw one cannulation procedure (the insertion of a small plastic tube into a vein using a needle in order to administer medicine) take just 10 minutes whilst previous procedures without the headset had taken over an hour and caused much upset for the child.



"The doctor was able to quickly place a cannula without causing any pain or distress. It was simply amazing to observe. This ended up being an extremely positive experience for the child, their parents and for the staff!"

- Communication boxes have been distributed across our hospitals giving easy access to reading glasses, hearing aid batteries and magnifying glasses. Making a real difference for patients struggling to speak with staff or keep themselves occupied.
- Thousands of hand held mirrors were distributed as part of the 'Think Skin ... react to Risk' campaign. Aiming to reduce hospital acquired pressure damage by allowing staff to more easily monitor patients' skin.
- Volunteer Breast Feeding Friends have been kitted out with bespoke t-shirts. These wonderful volunteers help people get to grips with breast feeding and the new t-shirts really help them stand out in the wards.
- The charity has supported **peer to peer support sessions** for young people with long term health conditions transitioning to adult services, where they can chat with other young people in the same situation and share their concerns alongside nursing staff.
