## **Enhancing training opportunities for staff**



Following a grant from the Daisychain Benevolent Fund Trust, staff from Worcestershire Royal Hospital's children's ward are practicing life-saving techniques for young children in realistic scenarios. Thanks to the grant we were able to purchase a lifelike medical simulation mannequin.

The training simulation doll - named Arthur - provides advanced training opportunities for the children's team at Worcestershire Acute Hospitals NHS Trust. Arthur enables valuable practice for scenarios in assessing, diagnosing and treating young children in a wide range of medical situations such as anaphylaxis, seizure, respiratory conditions, and an extensive range of other high dependency situations.

Arthur is incredibly lifelike with realistic skin, hair and body parts which can move and react like a young child. The state-of-the-art training mannequin can even speak with preloaded phrases, as well as be connected to a real defibrillator or mechanical ventilator. So, staff can get hands-on practice of complex life-support situations for children in a safe and controlled environment.

- Thanks to a kind donation by local company, C R Macdonald, the children's emergency department waiting room at the Alexandra Hospital is now equipped with noise cancelling headphones, reading books and dress up high vis, helping to make the experience that bit more comfortable for our youngest patients, and their loved ones.
- Sometimes the simplest things can make a real difference for patient experience, and thanks to your support Cardiac Rehabilitation Classes at Kidderminster Hospital and Treatment Centre are now sound tracked! An MP3 player and Bluetooth speaker have been provided for the exercise classes which take place three times a week, now with a retro playlist throughout. During the classes patients are taken through warmups, peak exercises, and a cool down routine. Being able to time the movements to music helps patients to achieve the 120bpm heart rates aimed for.
