
Title: WOLF MODE: Community Framework for Crisis Prevention

Purpose

To train and mobilize community members—students, parents, educators, and leaders—to recognize, interpret, and respond to behavioral intention signals before crisis occurs. Inspired by the protective, emotionally intelligent, and socially bonded nature of wolf packs, Wolf Mode is about collective vigilance, shared responsibility, and human-centered intervention.

Core Premise

People rarely act without intention. And intention often speaks before behavior does.

Behavioral intention often shows up in the language people use before harmful actions occur. Communities must learn to sense emotional distress, detect red flags, and respond with care—not fear.

The 5 Pillars of WOLF MODE**W – Watch for Language & Emotional Shifts**

- Alienation, nihilism, revenge ideation, violent metaphors, withdrawal.

O – Open Safe Channels for Reporting & Reflection

- Anonymous reporting, trauma-informed spaces, peer alerts.

L – Link to Support, Not Surveillance

- Mental health support, conflict mediation, community care.

F – Form Protection Circles

- Interdisciplinary “pack” teams trained in trauma-informed response.
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MODE = Ongoing Practice

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- **M – Monitor** subtle changes over time.
 - **O – Observe** social disconnection.
 - **D – Discuss** mental health and belonging.
 - **E – Engage** early, with empathy.
