Section 3: Address Objections with Gentleness

- **15. Answers may vary.** Listen to understand their concerns, ask where they're coming from, and hear their heart before offering solutions
- **16. Answers may vary.** Emotional objections are barriers people put up to avoid hearing the gospel; intellectual objections are genuine questions about faith and doctrine
- **17. Answers may vary.** Admit you don't know but offer to find out, redirect to what you do know from Scripture, or focus on the core gospel message

Section 4: Invite a Clear Response

- **20. Answers may vary.** Accept (receive Christ as Savior) or Reject (decline the gospel invitation)
- **21. Answers may vary.** Present the gospel clearly and emphasize the urgency, while being patient with their process and avoiding pushiness.
