- The Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery, well the Art Gallery part, is located at 2 Wellington St and exhibits fine and decorative arts, including selections from their extensive colonial art collection.
- Cataract Gorge and First Basin is a wilderness experience just 15 minutes' walk from the Launceston CBD and features the world's longest single span chairlift.
- Star Theatre Launceston is a restored Art Deco Theatre and Independent Cinema showing latest releases, cult classics, independent films and the odd theme night. There is a bar and café available so that you can enjoy a wine or beer during the movie, once you have finished your choc-top. 217b Invermay Rd
