



# Charging for Cryosurgery

## Overview

At Cool Renewal, LLC, we want to give Veterinarians the opportunity to expand their services offered by treating patients with skin lesions at an affordable and profitable rate, while also offering an affordable treatment option for pet owners.

While Cryosurgery is less expensive than traditional surgery, the treatment cost can vary depending on several factors, including:

- **SIZE OF LESION BEING TREATED**
  - 1-5mm will use minimal cryogen- Avg \$55-\$75+
  - 6-24mm will use more cryogen -Avg \$75-\$100+
  - Equine Lesions are much larger and thicker, requiring more cryogen, and usually multiple treatments- Equine Avg \$150-\$300+
- **TYPE & LOCATION OF LESION BEING TREATED**
  - Simple skin tag, papilloma, sebaceous adenoma removal- Avg \$55-\$75+
  - Complex body tumor, eyelid tumor, distichia, oral lesions- Avg \$100-\$200+
- **IF MULTIPLE TREATMENTS WILL BE REQUIRED**
  - If more than one lesion requires treating (i.e. multiple skin tags) there may be a flat rate for the first lesion, for example, \$55, then a charge for each additional lesion treated, usually \$25-\$40 per additional lesion (depending on size and amount of additional lesions).
  - Retreatments will be billed at a small discount, usually \$10-\$20 less than the first treatment.
- **IS ANESTHESIA OR SEDATION REQUIRED**
  - In cases which anesthesia or sedation is required, the cost of cryosurgery is more expensive, usually in the \$150 to \$200 range.
- **YOUR CLINIC LOCATION**
  - Ultimately, your clinic should charge what you think clients in your area can afford or are willing to pay for the procedure. Some clinics in very rural areas charge as little as \$35 for a simple skin tag removal, and other clinics in highly populated affluent areas may charge \$100
