A time to remember, a time to be glad, that the hard work is over, but the passing is sad.


From small beginnings, new generations have come.

Ken Dow shared some background about his Dad, Herb who lived in Corinna all his life.


"My father worked in a woolen mill at a young age, then became an electrician and then a teacher. His interest in restoration began when he spent spare time in a friend's auto-body garage. Always interested in mechanical devices, he came across an old, single-piston gasoline engine once used to power a small saw mill at a local farm. The engine had not been used for many years and was sunk in the dirt out behind a barn. After a few minutes of negotiation, the owner agreed to sell the engine. Herb dug it out of the dirt, loaded up the parts and pieces and took it home. I asked, "What are you going to do with that load of junk?" Herb said, "I'm going to make it work again!"

Over the following years he found and restored a number of those "-lungers." The chug-a-chug of the engines running was a common sound in his neighborhood. Herb travelled with his engines to parades, local fairs and museum events. He always enjoyed starting them up and answering questions about the old style technology, once common on farms and homesteads.

Rae Johnston received a bouquet of flowers from Jay and Linda Andrews, faithful attendees at our monthly suppers. Rae has been organizing the suppers for 25 years.


