Keith & Thelma owned and operated Panther Fuel, The Peat Patio Greenhouse, operated an over-the-road trucking firm, farmed potatoes and raised livestock. Thelma enjoyed working with the Whited Bible Camp kitchen crew and was known as the camp's bread maker from 1972-1992. She started her Christian walk at The Christian Missionary Alliance Church, after she married, she joined the Littleton Full Gospel Assembly Church, where she was the organist, choir director, and Sunday School Superintendent. She later attended the Houlton Wesleyan Church and Littleton Baptist Church. She acquired many dear friends in the Ladies Sunday School Classes and the Ladies Bible Studies.

She is survived by James & Rondise Watson and John & Brittany Benn, four grandchildren Lezley Jones, Amber Hines, Jerusha Benn and Jordan Benn, 14 great grandchildren, three great-great grandchildren and one brother, Roger Stone. She was predeceased by her parents, her brother Ervin Stone and his wife Betty, and her husband R. Keith Henderson who passed 27 years ago.
