



# Remembering, Lois Eleiott and Nan Miller



Every volunteer at the museum finds their role. Some of us do a lot of jobs, some of us feel comfortable doing one. It takes every volunteer to keep our museum going. Since our opening in 2001, the group of original volunteers have slowly left us one by one. As I say, slowly, it really seems like it has happened all too fast. In this newsletter, we say good-bye to two of the last in that group. These volunteers I have known all my life. Lois was my mother and Nan was her best friend. They grew up just across the border in Canada and married Littleton boys, Ken Eleiott and Arnold Miller on March 22, 1944 in a double ceremony.

Through the early years of the museum, mom could be found with a broom, a mop, some window cleaner or a paint brush. She later became the one who greeted the guests as they trickled in for the monthly suppers. She had a chat with everyone who came through the door. Lately, she didn't make it to the suppers as

often, but even last fall, she was right around visiting friends and neighbors.

On February 3, my mom passed away at Madigan Estates. She was just three months, 26 days shy of her 100th birthday. We will celebrate a life well lived on Sunday, May 28th at 2 p.m. at the Littleton Cemetery with a reception here at the museum. We hope you will join us that day. Nan, in the earlier days of the museum, contributed desserts for our suppers or worked on the dessert table. She and her husband, Arnie donated a potato grader and other items for our displays. Ironically, both Nan and mom spent time at Madigan Rehab before Christmas and then moved into long-term care as roommates. They got to reminisce about days gone by and give each other some comfort in recalling the days growing up in Canada.

On March 22, Nan, 99, followed my mom to celebrate their wedding anniversary in a land beyond. Our two families and the museum group will miss these two kind-hearted souls, but will cherish the memories we have. Nan's service was held on April 1. Donations were designated to the Agricultural Museum and the Greater Houlton Christian Academy, 27 School St. Houlton, ME 04730.
