We hope the next time you visit you will take a stroll down the hall to see the progress. Dee Cote and Mac Eleiott have contributed weathered wood, and some was salvaged from the bridge itself. We will also have several paintings and photos of the covered bridge, which will be on display. One of the photographs by Bill Dunn, was donated in memory of Phyllis McBride Hovey by her husband Mel. Phyllis grew up on the hill from the bridge. She used to slide in the winter with her sisters, who are in the photo below, down toward the bridge.

The Northland opened in November 1930 with a gala affair. The hotel became the center of community activities hosting civic groups, elegant banquets in their spacious dining room and formal dances in the ballroom. Many adults from the area had their first formal portrait done as a toddler in the mezzanine above the ballroom by Olan Mills. The hotel was torn down in 1978. Bangor Savings Bank is located in its place today. The dishes in the above photo were recently donated to the museum and used at the hotel.
