
Congratulations from the Administrative Team

the Way to the Forum." We know you will enjoy this humorous and lively performance. We want to congratulate all these students for their fine work and efforts.



SYNORSIS-OF SCENES

Synopsis

A Funny Thing Happened On The Way To The Forum is a two act play which also includes a Prologue as is typical of classical Greek andRoman theatre.

Act One

In Act One, Sennex and his wife Domina are preparing to leave on a journey to visit Domina's mother for her birthday. As they leave, they put Hysterium, their most loyal and long serving slave, in charge of their house and their only child, Hero. Hero is a love-struck young man with his heart set on Phillia a young girl from the House of Concubines of Marcus Lycus. Hero is determined to have the young girl for his bride, and tells his slave, Pseudolus, that he may have his freedom if Pseudolus is able to get the girl for him. Encouraged by the possibilities, Pseudolus schemes, plots and, ultimately faces death at the sword of Captain Miles Gloriosis, the man who has bought Phillia for his bride.

All of this in order to gain his freedom.

Act Two

Pseudolus's life is hanging in the balance. Pseudolus manages to escape death, by convincing the Captain that his bride has died. To pull of the ruse, he enlists the help of Hysterium, who he dresses up as Phillia and tries to pass off as a dead body. The Captain catches on to the ruse as Hysterium and Pseudolus lead the Captain and his army on a mad chase through the city of Rome. Phillia and Hero try to escape to the harbor only to be caught and brought back by Marcus Lycus. All looks lost, but as the song at the beginning states, this is a comedy. Stay rooted to your chairs to discover how everything turns out in the end.





Although this production has been a lot of hard work, we hope that everyone involved has had as much fun as we had putting the show together. 
We have had many people ask us why we would choose a show like this for a high school. The answer is, basically, because it's funny. After several meetings and discussions about how to best support the comic talents of our students, while still providing a strong pedagogical base, we chose A Funny Thing... for several reasons. First, it's a great comedy, it has challenging music for the orchestra. but it is accessible for our students and their singing voices. Also, this is a great technical piece, which has provided challenging opportunities for our design and technical theatre students.

After reading the script and listening to the score all of us decided that A Funny Thing..., with its titillating mixture of classic comedy, fun yet challenging music, and potential for student exploration, was the perfect mix between learning opportunities for students and entertainment value. Unanimously we all agreed that this light, fast-paced, witty, irreverent comedy, is "the perfect escape from life's troubles" and the ideal show for Main Stage 2004.

Based on the writings of Ancient Rome's most notorious playwright, Plautus, this show allows students the unique opportunity to explore history, while learning the nuance and energy of vaudeville, and physical theatre. A Funny Thing... is incredibly fast paced, requiring the actors to develop strong physical characters, excellent focus and perfect comedic timing. All actors are kept on their toes as the characters interact in a series of mind-bogglingly complex scams and cons, layered so thick that it's a riot when things inevitably go wrong.

Please sit back, enjoy, and let all your worries drift away as we watch the convoluted journey of the slave Pseudolus who seeks his freedom through a series of non-stop scams and shameless manipulations of those around him.






Jocelyn Hildebrand (2nd Citizen/Chorus)




Jenna Lehne (Panacea the Courtesan)





Jamie Richards (Hair and Makeup)




