Somewhere in the Midwest in the 1950's, Chad, a hip-swiveling, guitar-playing roustabout is being released from jail ("Jailhouse Rock"). The Warden doesn't appreciate a guy like Chad ridin' into town, playin' his music and excitin' the local women.

In a dreary little town nearby, Natalie, a young mechanic, is dreaming of love and adventure. She yearns for one true love to take her away. She is oblivious that her best friend Dennis is in love with her.

At Sylvia's, the local honky tonk, the whole town sings the blues ("Heartbreak Hotel"). Natalie's widowed father Jim joins in but the group are interrupted by the roar of a motorcycle as Chad rides into town ("Roustabout"). Chad is in need of a mechanic and is introduced to Natalie. She is instantly smitten ("One Night With You") and promises to fix his bike.

Chad finds out that excitement is outlawed under the Mayor's strict rules: NO loud music and NO indecent behavior. He promises to breathe some life into this sad, little town! With a mere touch, the broken-down jukebox and the honky tonk spring to life ("C'mon Everybody").

Mayor Matilda enters with Earl, the Sheriff, and her son, Dean. She scolds the citizens for dancing and singing, and vows to locate the root of this new evil. Dean meets Lorraine, Sylvia's daughter, and the two share a nervous and flirtatious smile.

While Natalie is working on Chad's motorcycle, she tells him of her dreams of the open road, and he tells her that she must follow her heart ("Follow That Dream").

In an attempt to look more girly, and to impress Chad, Natalie puts on the only dress she owns—a tattered, oil stained dress she had used to clean car engines. Dennis comes to tell Natalie how he feels about her, but Chad enters and interrupts. Completely ignoring Natalie, Chad asks Dennis to become his sidekick and the overjoyed Dennis accepts.

The beautiful and glamorous Sandra who is the owner of local museum appears, and Chad is struck down with a case of hardcore love ("One Night With You"—reprise). Chad tries to smooth-talk her, but she resists ("Teddy Bear/Hound Dog").

Later at Sylvia's Honky Tonk, Jim and Sylvia speak about the strange, lascivious behavior that has befallen the town since Chad's arrival. Natalie enters in her greasy dress and her friend Lorraine helps her change into one of her own dresses—it is clean and cute and Natalie looks lovely. With newfound confidence Natalie rushes off in pursuit of Chad.

Sylvia and Jim agree it's better to be alone, when Sandra enters and Jim instantly falls for her ("One Night With You"—reprise). Too nervous to speak to such a vision of beauty, he rushes out.

Thrilled by Dean's affection, Lorraine teaches him to dance ("That's All Right"). Sylvia interrupts, insisting that it's NOT all right for them to be together, and Dean rushes out. Matilda has decided to send Dean to Military School and takes him to catch the next bus out of town. Dean tells his new love the terrible news—they're about to be separated. Hopelessly in love, they decide to run off together ("It's Now Or Never").

Both Jim and Chad now chase Sandra, but she will have nothing to do with either of them. When Dennis shows off his new hunting cap to Natalie and explains how it makes him feel like "one of the guys," Natalie has a sudden inspiration and takes the cap. Alone in the garage, she dresses as leather-jacketed male roustabout "Ed" ("Love Me Tender").

As Chad bemoans Sandra's lack of attraction to him, Dennis comes up with an idea. He volunteers to take her a Shakespearean love sonnet on Chad's behalf. Desperate, Chad agrees. But before Dennis leaves, leather-jacketed roustabout Ed rides in ("Blue Suede Shoes). Chad is impressed by Ed's coolness and manliness and asks Ed to be his new sidekick. Dennis is heartbroken! Chad instructs Ed that his first job as his new sidekick is to give the sonnet to Miss Sandra.

Jim tells Chad that he's in love with a woman who doesn't love him back. Chad tells him that in order to win the girl, Jim must dress and act more like Chad and gives him a much-needed lesson in coolness ("Don't Be Cruel").

Sandra is moved by the sonnet that Ed has given her and finds herself drawn to this strange-looking young man ("One Night With You"—reprise). She becomes intent on seducing him ("Let Yourself Go").

Mayor Matilda is more intent on cracking down on the perceived immoral behavior that is rampant in town. She's stunned to see that it's her own precious Dean kissing Lorraine. After showing his appalled mother that he has learned to dance, he and Lorraine run off into the night and Matilda vows to throw Chad in jail for what he has done to her town.

Chad runs to hide in the abandoned fair ground, and Ed follows. Jim feels that Sylvia has grown cold and bitter when she advises him against chasing Sandra. He then gives Sylvia a very surprising kiss, and a stunned Sylvia suddenly falls for him. Soon, everyone in town finds themselves escaping to the fairgrounds, searching for someone to love ("Can't Help Falling In Love").

The restless townspeople gather at the fairgrounds ("All Shook Up"). Dennis comes upon Natalie, still dressed as Ed. Dennis is upset about the way Chad treats her ("It Hurts Me") but Natalie insists that Chad is the only guy for her.

In an attempt to win Chad, Natalie gets an idea—she convinces Chad to teach Ed how to seduce a woman ("A Little Less Conversation"). But in the process, Ed winds up kissing Chad. Chad quickly reaffirms his machismo ("Power Of My Love").

Jim and Chad suddenly realize they are both in love with the same woman. Jim confesses his love to Sandra, but she doesn't even remember meeting him. He is heartbroken. When left to think, Chad realizes that he has feelings for his new sidekick ("I Don't Want To").

Mayor Matilda, followed as always by the silent Sheriff Earl, vows to bring the roustabout down ("Devil In Disguise").

The heartbroken Jim runs into Sylvia, who is wearing her best Sunday dress. He wonders what she's doing out there this time of night, and she confesses her newfound feelings for him ("There's Always Me"). Jim can't handle this revelation.

Dean and Lorraine plan to catch the morning train out of town, but Chad convinces them to stay and fight for their love ("If I Can Dream").

Matilda gathers the townspeople together to form a pious posse to both find her son and arrest Chad. Chad enters, as does Dean and Lorraine—and the final confrontation begins...

Will true love prevail? ("Fools Fall In Love") Will the power of music win the day? Will this small town in the Midwest survive getting All Shook Up? These questions and more are answered as the characters come together for the finale ("Burning Love").

Biographies

ELVIS PRESLEY

Elvis Aaron Presley, in the humblest of circumstances, was born to Vernon and Gladys Presley in a two-room house in Tupelo, Mississippi on January 8, 1935. His twin brother, Jessie Garon, was stillborn, leaving Elvis to grow up as an only child. He and his parents moved to Memphis, Tennessee in 1948, and Elvis graduated from Humes High School there in 1953.

Elvis' musical influences were the pop and country music of the time, the gospel music he heard in church and at the all-night gospel sings he frequently attended, and the black R&B he absorbed on historic Beale Street as a Memphis teenager. In 1954, he began his singing career with the legendary Sun Records label in Memphis. In late 1955, his recording contract was sold to RCA Victor. By 1956, he was an international sensation. With a sound and style that uniquely combined his diverse musical influences and blurred and challenged the social and racial barriers of the time, he ushered in a whole new era of American music and popular culture.

He starred in 33 successful films, made history with his television appearances and specials, and knew great acclaim through his many, often record-breaking, live concert performances on tour and in Las Vegas. Globally, he has sold over one billion records, more than any other artist. His American sales have earned him gold, platinum or multi-platinum awards for 150 different albums and singles, far more than any other artist. Among his many awards and accolades were 14 Grammy nominations (3 wins) from the National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences, the Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award, which he received at age 36, and his being named One of the Ten Outstanding Young Men of the Nation for 1970 by the United States Jaycees. Without any of the special privileges his celebrity status might have afforded him, he honourably served his country in the U.S. Army.

His talent, good looks, sensuality, charisma, and good humor endeared him to millions, as did the humility and human kindness he demonstrated throughout his life. Known the world over by his first name, he is regarded as one of the most important figures of twentieth century popular culture. Elvis died at his Memphis home, Graceland, on August 16, 1977.

JOE DIPIETRO wrote the book and lyrics to the international hit I LOVE YOU, YOU'RE PERFECT, NOW CHANGE, and currently on Broadway, the Tony Award winning MEMPHIS. Other shows include ALL SHOOK UP on Broadway and the worldwide hit comedy OVER THE RIVER AND THROUGH THE WOODS and THE TOXIC AVENGER! THE MUSICAL!. Regionally: THE THING ABOUT MEN, O. HENRY'S LOVERS (Goodspeed Musicals), THE KISS AT CITY HALL (Pasadena Playhouse), THE ART OF MURDER (Edgar Award, Best Mystery Play, 2000.) He has also written new books to Rodgers and Hammerstein's ALLEGRO (Signature Theatre), Rodgers and Hart's BABES IN ARMS (Goodspeed Musicals) and the forthcoming "new" Gershwin musical HEAVEN ON EARTH. He lives in Manhattan with his pug, Rocco.




Richard Charlton Guitar


Sierra Larsen Sound Crew



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

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




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
