"A Need for Machining – Machining for Every Need"

Hello,

The Miltonic's ML-1440 I am selling was originally purchased by the Vocational School I taught Precision Machining at. The machine was placed in the co-instructors shop to try to get him comfortable with CNC machines. The students were only allowed to run their programs on the verify screen. On the rare occasion the students were allowed to run a program and cut material, it was the blue plastic wax.

After a couple of years of this I moved the machine to my shop where the students basically cut brass and aluminum for chess pieces. The only time steel was cut was on rare occasion when someone needed and actual steel part made, and it was me that programmed and ran it.

About two years later and a new co-instructor, the Lathe was put up for sale where I purchased it for my home shop for \$11K. A couple months later I underwent a couple major back surgeries which made me resign my teaching position and give up my home shop. The lathe was run less than five hours in my personal shop, and it was only used to turn the front end of a 3/8" x 3" set screw to .200 diam by ½" back. I think I ran 250 pieces. The machine has sat ever since.

So, the machine has low cut time on it and zero crashes that I know about. I have included a bunch of photos, where you can plainly see the paint around the spindle and ways that is still like brand new. This machine is like new, but I don't know how many "ON" hours is actually on the machine. The hour meter was broken while in the first co-instructor's shop, not sure how or why...

The eight station tool turret is a fantastic addition to the machine and it works flawlessly. The machine has many possibilities and add-ons available.
