Renewal rates for 2024 BASC Membership have increased the first time in over ten years. The new rates are as follows:

If member is 55 to 80 years –(will turn 80 in 2024) dues are \$15

If member is 80 to 90 years –(will turn 90 in 2024)... dues are \$10

Members who turned 90 in 2023 are life members and no dues are required. However, the renewal form needs to be filled out and returned to update or verify addresses, phone numbers, email, etc.

BASC's year runs January 1<sup>st</sup> through December 31<sup>st</sup>. According to Section 4.7. of the Bylaws: Annual dues must be paid by January 1<sup>st</sup> of each year to maintain active membership. If not paid by January 31<sup>st</sup>, member will be considered "INACTIVE" and shall not take part in organizational events until dues are paid.
