Bishop Michael Curry the current presiding bishop and primate of the Episcopal Church is retiring. Bishop Curry is seventy-one years old and has faithfully served for nine years, so he deserves a big rest! Bishop Curry now can enjoy being with his wife and two adult children and their families. 








Mother's Day Service—Mother Asha preached a beautiful homily about "The Water"
