Advent ... "A Season for Those Who Are Troubled"

Dear Christian Friends,

On the Third Sunday in Advent, Saint Mark's Congregation will receive a number of new and renewing members with special prayers and a special Christmas Lunch. I can hardly wait to celebrate the Eucharist that Sunday with all of you. I ask all of you to take a moment to introduce yourselves to any one you do not know among our newcomers. They are waiting for your welcome.

But, the *Advent Season is one intended to teach us how to wait*. The Lutheran Pastor, The Rev. Dietrich Bonhoeffer, martyred by the German Nazis, had a most interesting and true understanding of Advent that I would like to share with you and all our newcomers.

Pastor Bonhoeffer said: "Celebrating Advent means learning how to wait... Not everyone wants to wait... certainly not those who are satisfied, contented, and feel that they live in the best of all possible worlds! In fact, those who learn to wait for God are uneasy about their way of life now, but yet have seen a vision of greatness in the world of the future and are patiently expecting its fulfillment. Indeed, the celebration of Advent is possible only to those who are troubled in soul, who know themselves to be imperfect and poor, who look forward to something greater to come. For these kind of people, it is enough to wait in humble fear and expectation, until the Holy One himself comes down to us, God in the child in the Manger."

Those who wait are convinced there is still One to come who will create peace, justice, reconciliation and a resurrection life. Waiting is hard work and requires a troubled soul. It is not the activity of those living the "Dolce Vita". It is not a sport for the rich and famous, nor the consumer culturalists among us. So, I wonder where Advent Season finds you? I know that I am waiting and praying for peace and healing in our own community and especially in the Ukraine and Russia. As we wait at Saint Mark's, please welcome those who are newcomers to our community and perhaps are waiting for a future yet to come with hope.
