Student Bursary Program

The Student Bursary Program is a program intended to support the development of future security professionals by providing a bursary to financially assist them in financing their education. Applicants will:

1. Be in their final year their second or third year of police foundations or a security-related discipline at a community college or university.
2. Have an average of B+ or greater (enclose a copy of the first year transcript)
3. Write a 1000 word essay concerning a topic relevant to a private sector security profession
4. Receive a letter of recommendation from their program coordinator confirming their integrity, intention to pursue a career in the private sector security profession or policing, and stating the current grade average for the candidate.
5. Receive a letter of recommendation from a volunteer organization confirming their volunteer status, integrity, professionalism, punctuality, and dedication.
6. Successful candidates will receive a complementary one year ASIS student membership paid for by the chapter, and in so doing agree to promote the association amongst the student population.
7. Bursary recipients will be required to attend at least one chapter meeting within the school year in which the bursary applies to report on their progress, and any initiatives they have undertaken in support of ASIS

All applications must be received via email no later than October 15, 2018.
