

ALAN D. SHINN

Alan D. Shinn is Professor of Music and Director of Percussion and Jazz Studies at Texas Tech University. He holds the Bachelor of Music Education degree from the University of Missouri and the Master of Music degree from Texas Tech University. His primary teachers were Tim Lautzeheiser and Ron Dyer. Prior to coming to Texas Tech in 1982 as faculty percussionist, he served as instructor of Percussion and Jazz at Southwest Texas State University in San Marcos, Tx. Over eighty percussion students have graduated with music degrees at TTU since 1982 and are enjoying careers in education (all levels) and performances as well as music business and industry. Many former jazz students are performing professionally or are teaching in public schools, junior college or universities.

Shinn is Principal Timpanist with the Lubbock Symphony Orchestra and a former member of the Austin Symphony Orchestra. He has also served as Principal Timpanist/Percussionist with the Roswell Symphony and has performed a number of times with the chamber orchestras of Santa Fe Pro Musica and 20th Century Unlimited. In March of 2001, Shinn performed with the Santa Fe Pro Musica and the Smithsonian Chamber Players in Washington D.C. As a member of these organizations and the musical communities in which he lives, he has performed with Henry Mancini, Peter Nero, Roger Williams, Doc Severinsen, The Fifth Dimension, Rita Moreno, Michael Martin Murphy, Tony Bennett, William Warfield, Mark O'Connor, Jose Feliciano, Mitzi Gaynor, Engelbert Humperdinct, Cathy Rigy in Peter Pan and Carol Channing in Hello Dolly.

Under his Direction, Texas Tech's Jazz Ensemble 1 has taken honors at many jazz festivals. The group has performed with such renowned jazz artists as Loule Bellson, Tony Campise, Phil Wilson, Bob Mintzer, Tuck and Patti, Dave Pietro, Ed Calle, Ernie Watts and Mike Mainleri. The Tech Jazz Ensemble has opened shows for Spyro Gyra, the Yellowjackets and Jay Leno. In 1996 the ensemble opened for Arturo Sandoval and the UNC Jazz Lab Band 1 at the UNC/Greeley, CO Jazz Festival.

Their Cd Seein' the Light...Hearin' the Hub-Tones (Sea Breeze Jazz) received a Grammy nomination in 1998. Shinn has produced CD's that have garnered national attention for jazz singer Carla Helmbrecht, trumpeter Mary Benner and vibraphonist Lisa Rogers. He served as Associate Producer on Helmbrecht's 2001 release Be Cool, Be Kind (Heart Music) which climbed to number eight on the Gavin Jazz Charts. He is currently finishing his second TTU big band project which features Austin jazz legend Tony Campise. He has recorded as a percussionist on many of his own projects as well as on albums by Lubbock artists Terry Allen and The Maines Brothers.

Alan Shinn is an active clinician and adjudicator throughout the Southwest and Midwest and has served as an Educational/Product Consultant for REMO Inc. and Pro-Mark. He is currently an Artist Endorser of innovative Percussion.

FRED J. ALLEN

Fred J. Allen is Director of Bands at Stephen F. Austin State University in Nacogdoches, Texas. In addition to conducting the Wind Ensemble at SFASU, he also teaches conducting and music education classes. He oversees nearly three hundred band students involved in the SFA band program, in three concert groups, the marching and pep bands and several chamber ensembles.

Under his direction, the Wind Ensemble at SFA has performed at conventions of the Texas Music Educators Association and College Band Directors National Association. His SFA Wind Ensemble has performed with several guest artists: trumpeter Allen Vizzutti, the Resounding Winds Saxophone Quartet, clarinetist Eddie Daniels, and conductors Keith Brion, Frederick Fennell and Kate Tamarkin. Under his leadership the SFA Wind Ensemble continues its long tradition of commissioning new works from composers. Recent commissions have produced works from Dan Welcher, David Maslanka, Adam Gorb, James Syler and Frank Ticheli.

Allen has conducted All-Region and All-State Bands throughout Texas and the Southwest, where he is also an active clinician and adjudicator. He has often served as guest conductor for bands playing at the Mid-West Band Convention, and has conducted the Seoul Wind Ensemble and the Al Fine Concert Band in Taegu, Korea. He remains current in the public school classroom through regular visits to area band classes, from beginners through high school.

Allen has published several pieces for band which draw upon his experience teaching band in the public schools in Texas. These works have been performed frequently at band conventions and festivals across the United States and recently, in Korea, Great Britain, Germany and Australia. He has several commissioned works in progress.

As a woodwind specialist, he has performed professionally at Opryland U.S.A, for the Ice Capades and for over forty musical productions and operas. He is a former member of the Orchestra of the Pines, the Abilene Philharmonic, the Fort Worth Civic Orchestra, and the Irving Symphony, as well as community bands in Fort Worth and Lubbock.
