

Jeff Hellmer

Is associate Director of Jazz Studies at the University of Texas at Austin, where he teaches courses in jazz studies and conducts jazz ensembles and combos. He has led the UT Jazz Orchestra in performances at two recent IAJE Conventions, a guest performance at the UNC/Greeley Jazz Festival, and with artists such as Diane Schuur, Slide Hampton, and Gary Foster. A two-time finalist in the Great American Jazz Piano Competition, he has performed and taught from Connecticut to Alaska to Taiwan, and has released a solo compact disc Windows available through Bayside Distribution. Performances in other genres include work for Walt Disney Productions, Harvey Pittel, and the Dallas Wind Symphony. His compositions for jazz ensemble are published by Concept Music, UNC Press, and C.L. Barnhouse. He is co-author of the Jazz Theory and Practice, published by Alfred.

Denis DiBlasio

"Jazz, virtually the art of spontaneity, is personified in the playing of saxophone and flautist Denis DiBlasio. Always working without a musical net, safety isn't in the cards for this musical giant of the baritone sax. Each performance equaled in intensity and depth by a punctuation or razor sharp high notes, mellowing to a penetration of expressions only attainable by a master, Denis DiBlasio plays the most complicated scores to perfection."

Denis DiBlasio has taught around the world. His entertaining style and wit has kept him extremely busy on the jazz concert and clinic circuit. Combining education, positive motivation and fun has made him one of the country's most popular clinicians and performers. His attitude of "making music fun" creates an atmosphere where kids don't have to be afraid to take a risk. All attempts are valid and mistakes are welcome.

DiBlasio has a Masters degree from the University of Miami in Florida. Soon afterwards he was on the Maynard Ferguson Band acting as Musical Director for 5 years. On the band he wrote, played woodwinds, scatted and even sang. He is the director of the jazz department at Rowan College in New Jersey along with being the conductor of the Jazz Lab Band. His arranging and composing has gone on to be published by Kendor, William Allen, Kjos, Doug Beach and Hal Leonard Publishers. His texts on jazz improvisation have been published by Kendor, Houston and Jamey Aebersold Publishers. He is also a clinician for the Yamaha Musical Corporation.

His group The Denis DiBlasio Quartet performs extensively in both concert and clinic settings. Internationally his performances have brought him to Japan, Spain, France, Canada, Denmark and Switzerland to name a few. He is in constant demand nationally and is usually booked up to a year in advance.

The latest recordings "Catch Me" and "Seven Giant Steps to Heaven" showcase DiBlasio with his quartet that he presently tours with. RICHARD L. FLOYD

In 1983 Richard Floyd was appointed State Director of Music Activities for the University Interscholastic League at the University of Texas at Austin where he coordinates all facets of secondary school music competition for some 3500 performing organizations throughout the state. In addition he routinely serves as an adjunct member of the faculty in the university Department of Music on an as needed basis. His other professional endeavors include the post of Musical Director and Conductor of the Austin Symphonic Band.

Prior to his appointment at the University of Texas, Mr. Floyd served on the faculty at the University of South Florida as Professor of Conducting and at Baylor University in Texas where he held the position of Director of Bands for nine years. His musical achievements include appearances at numerous state and regional music conferences, a distinguished performance for the 1977 College Band Directors National Association, the 1981 Music Educators National Conference the 1989 Grand Finale concert for the Mid-West International Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago and the opening concert for the 1993 American Bandmasters Association Convention in New Orleans. Performances by his various ensembles have been heard on radio broadcasts in both the United States and Europe. Before joining the faculty at Baylor he taught junior high school and high school band in the Richardson, Texas public schools and served as music coordinator for that district's nationally acclaimed music program.

Mr. Floyd has toured extensively throughout the United States, Canada and Europe as a clinician, adjudicator and conductor including appearances in 37 states and 8 foreign countries. He has received the praise of numerous composers including Emst Krenek, Karel Husa and Roger Nixon for his sensitive interpretation of their music and is also co-author of Best Music For Beginning Band soon to be published by Manhattan Beach Music.

During Mr. Floyd's professional career he has held positions of leadership on many state and national committees for music education and wind music performances and in 1980 was one of ten conductors nationwide to be recognized by The School Musician for outstanding contributions to is profession. Presently he is a member of the John Philip Sousa Foundation Board of Directors, the American Bandmasters Association Composition Competition Selection Committee, Secretary to the Jury of the Frederick Fennel International Young Conductors Competition and is an ex-officio member of the Texas Music Educator's Association Executive Board. Since 1979 he has served as National Secretary/Treasurer of the CBDNA and is currently chairman of the National Federation Music Committee.
