

Bill Snodgrass

Bill Snodgrass has served as Director of Jazz Studies at the University of Texas at Arlington since 1976. Under his direction the UTA Jazz Orchestra has recorded ten albums and has appeared as invited guest artists for pretigious international jazz festivals and concert tours in Montreaux, Switzerland; Beijing, People's Republic of China: Nassau, Commonwealth of the Bahamas; Sao Paulo, Brazil; Montreal, Canada; Vienna, Austria; and Manila, The Philippines. The UTA JO has also given feature performance for the national conferences of MENC, American Broadcasting Association, TMEA, and IAJE. Mr. Snodgrass served as Band Editor for Stan Kenton's Creative World Music Publications and has published compositions for jazz ensemble marching band and orchestra. Mr. Snodgrass received his master's degree from Texas Tech University where he majored in violin performance and music education. In addition to performing on bass in several professional jazz groups and serving nine years on the permanent faculty of the Stan Kenton Summer Jazz Workshops. Mr. Snodgrass also played violin in the Kansas City, Tulsa, and Lubbock Symphony Orchestras. He currently serves as Auditions Coordinator for the TMEA All-State Jazz Ensemble and is the current President of Texas Unit of the International Association of Jazz Educators. Mr. Snodgrass has served as an adjudicator and clinician for college and public school orchestras, wind ensembles and jazz ensembles throughout the Southwest, and has been guest conductor clinician for the Oklahoma and New York All-State jazz ensembles.

Mike Bogle

A versatile musician, Mike Bogle was nominated for a Grammy Award in 1992 for his arrangement of Chick Corea's composition "Got a Match?". An accomplished trombonist, pianist, composer, and arranger, Mr. Bogle currently calls Arlington, Texas his home, where he is Assistant Director of Jazz Studies at the University of Texas at Arlington. Mr. Bogle's performance credits include: James Moody, Slide Hampton, Jaco Pastorious, Ira Sullivan, Pete Christlieb, Duffy Jackson, Bobby Caldwell, Burt Bacharach, Diana Ross, Tom Jones, "Mark Morganelli and the Jazz Forum All-Stars". The UNT One O'Clock Lab Band, The University of Miami Concert Jazz Band, The UTA Jazz Orchestra and The Sambuca Big Band. Mike has recorded with many Latin music artists and organizations in Miami including Willie Chirino and Lissette, Tania Records, Gustavo Rojas, and El Grupo "Chequere". Mr. Bogle's musical talents and affiliations have taken him around the world to such locations as France, Portugal, Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Peru, Mexico, Puerto Rico, The Bahamas, and Canada. Mike Bogle is a member of the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (NARAS). American Society of Composer, Authors & Publishers (ASCAP), International Association of Jazz Educators (JAJE), Texas Music Educators Association (TMEA), and American Federation of Musicians (AFM), Mr. Bogle is published by Harold Gore Publishing Co., Denton, TX, and University of Northern Colorado Press, Greeley, CO. GLENN A. RICHTER

Glenn Richter is in his 20th year at the University of Texas in Austin. He serves as a Professor of Instrumental Conducting in the School of Music, teaching courses in conducting, arranging, band literature, the music business, and honors seminars in the Plan II program. For 15 years he directed the UT Longhorn Band program, which was honored in 1986 by the Sudler Trophy. Under his direction the Longhorn Band program enjoyed many national profile performances, including Lincoln Center, The Today Show, two Presidential Inauguarations, and major concerts in the Houston Wortham Center and the Dallas Meyerson Center. Active as a guest conductor of all-state and regional honor ensembles, Professor Richter twice served as guest conductor of the Mid-Texas Symphony in 1997. He has written a Computer Instructional Module for undergraduate conductors that was presented to an International Conference on Technology in Education.

His teaching background includes appointments as Conductor of the University of Michigan Marching Band and the Director of Bands position at the College Conservatory of Music at the University of Cincinnati. His Austin Reagan and LBJ School bands were consistent sweepstakes award winners. In 1995 the UT Ex Students Association recognized Glenn Richter with their "Top Hand" Award. He and his wife, Kathleen, received a special leadership award from Austin Westlake High School for service to the schools. They have two children, Zach, a Pre-law senior at U.T. who has been accepted to Harvard Law School; and Kathleen, a freshman history major at UT and member of the UT Softball team.
