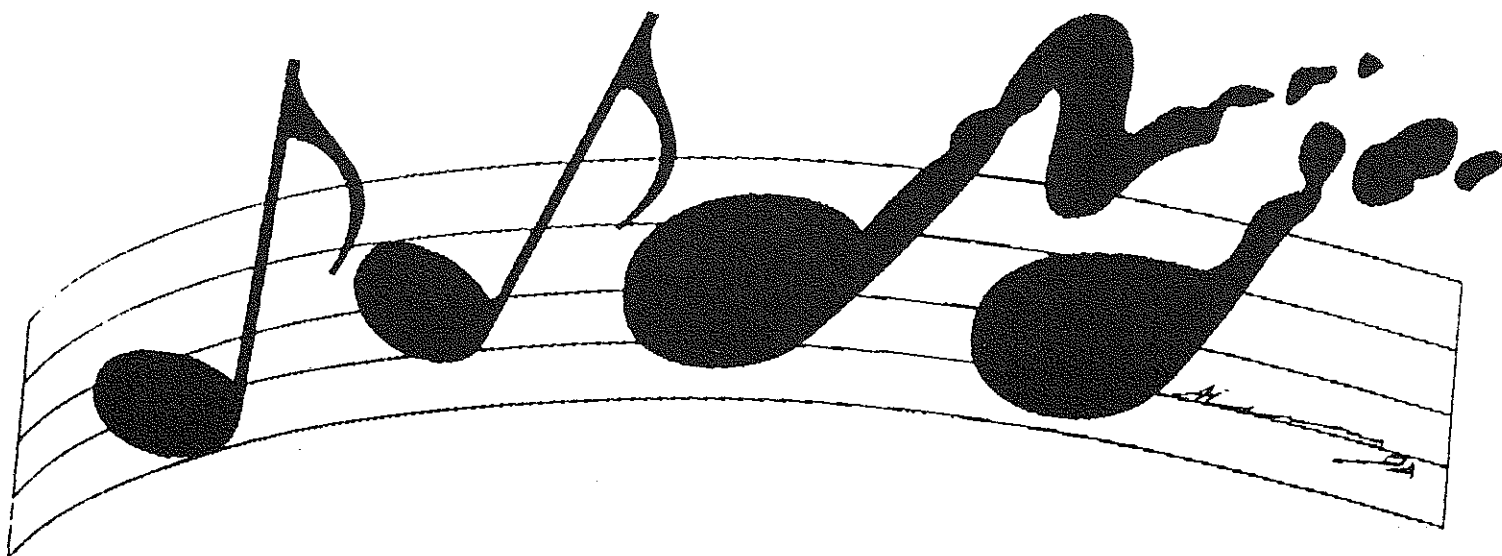

Paul Hageman

Paul Hageman is in his 16th year as director of Jazz Band I at Texas A&M University Kingsville where he is also Associate Professor of Trombone and Chair of the Music Department. He holds a Bachelor's degree from Louisiana Tech University and Master's and Doctorate degrees from the University of Northern Colorado in Trombone Performance. While at UNC, Hageman was a member of UNC Jazz Lab Band I.

The TAMUK jazz program, co-directed by James Warth, consists of three big bands, two combos, the Jazz Singers and jazz improvisation classes. Jazz Band I, directed by Paul Hageman, has performed at the TAMUK, Jazz Festival, the Coastal Bend Jazz Festival, the UT Longhorn Jazz Festival, the Fiesta Jazz Festival. In 1995, Jazz Band I was selected to perform at the TMEA Convention. In both 1997 and 1999, Jazz Band I was selected as one of eight college jazz bands to compete in the National Jazz Band Competition at the Mobile Jazz Festival.

A member of the International Association of Jazz Educators, Paul Hageman has served TMEA as Region XIV Jazz Chairman and as a clinician for Regions XIV and XV. He regularly adjudicates at many of the jazz festivals in Texas. He also co-directs the TAMUK Jazz Festival and is active as a clinician, soloist and arranger.

James Warth

James Warth, Assistant Professor of Music, has been teaching saxophone and jazz courses at Texas A&M University - Kingsville since 1992. He earned his Bachelor's degree in Music Education from the University of South Carolina and the Master's degree in Applied Music from the University of Texas at Austin.

An accomplished woodwind doubler, Mr. Warth has performed in a wide variety of classical and jazz concerts at venues throughout the world including an appearance with the Rotterdam Philharmonic Orchestra, under the direction of James Conlon. He was recently recorded two compact discs with the Nova Saxophone Quartet on the Musical Heritage Society label.

Currently he is in demand as a clinician and adjudicator throughout Texas, appears with various jazz groups, and performs on bass clarinet, e-flat clarinet and saxophones with the Corpus Christi Symphony.

BOBBY R. FRANCIS

Bobby Francis is currently the Director of Bands at Texas A&M University - Commerce (Formerly East Texas State University) where he conducts the Wind Ensemble, teaches graduate and undergraduate conducting and music education courses, and directs the TAMU "Pride" Marching Band. Since Mr. Francis became the director at TAMU-C, the TAMU-C Wind Ensemble has performed at the College Band Director's National Association Regional Conference in Wichita, Kansas, the Texas Music Educator's Association Conference in San Antonio, and the CBDNA National Conference in Athens, Georgia. Under his direction, the TAMU-Commerce Wind Ensemble has received critical acclaim from composers such as Karel Husa, David Maslanka, James Syler, and Eric Ewezon, Mr. Francis has produced four compact disc recordings of the Wind Ensemble that are available through Mark Custom Recording Service in Clarence, New York.

Prior to his appointment at TAMU-C, he was the Assistant Director of Bands at the University of Texas at Arlington. At the UTA, he was the director of the UTA Marching Band, taught music education classes and was the director of the Summer Music Camp program. He also performed as the clarinetist with the UTA Faculty Woodwind Quintet.

Mr. Francis was appointed as Music Director and Conductor for the Texas "Lone Star Ambassadors" in 1994. This group performed across Europe on a 16 day tour during the Summer of 1996 and will be touring again in 1998. There will be a 3rd performance tour in the year 2000. For more information concerning the tour and membership, contact Mr. Francis. In 1992, he conducted the premiere performance of the Plano Wind Symphony. He has served as a guest rehearsal clinician for the Texas Wind Symphony. He is in great demand as a guest conductor/clinician for honor bands in several states. Mr. Francis is an active clinician for many high school and junior high bands across the state. He is active as an adjudicator for both concert and marching events including State Marching Band contests in Texas and Oklahoma. Mr. Francis and the TAMU-C Wind Ensemble their debut at the Meyerson Symphony Center in Dallas in the Spring of 1995 and their debut at Carnegle hall in April of 1998.

Mr. Francis taught for many years in the Hurst-Eules-Bedford and Richardson Independence School Districts. During this time, he was responsible for teaching elementary, junior high/middle school and high school bands. His marching bands, concert bands, and jazz bands consistently received superior ratings at UIL and in invitational contests and festivals. Honors include "Best in Class" at the Six Flags Over Texas Invitational Festival.

Mr. Francis has Bachelor and Masters degrees from East Texas State University and has additional study at the University of North Texas. Mr. Francis continues as an active concert band, marching band clinician and adjudicator throughout Texas, Illinois, Oklahoma, Louisiana, Mississippi and New Mexico. He is also active in the development of student leadership through leadership and drum major clinics and workshops.
