#### Dr. Gary Garner

Dr. Gary Garner began his teaching career in Lubbock, Texas. From there he went to the University of Southern California as a member of the music faculty for four years before accepting an appointment at West Texas A&M University. He is currently in his 31st year at WTAMU, where he is Professor of Music and Director of Bands and Orchestra.

Garner has traveled extensively as clinician, guest conductor and flute soloist. He has recorded two albums of solo flute music and two albums of flute trios, one with his sons Brad and Blair and another with Blair and the eminent American flutist, Julius Baker. He has been the recipient of the WTSU Faculty excellence award, the Bohumil Makovsky award given by Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma for outstanding contributions to college bands, and the Minnie Piper Stevens award. He was chosen Bandmaster of the year in 1987 by The Texas Bandmasters Association. He is co-author of the book, *The Symphonic Band: A Quest for Excellence*.

The WTAMU Symphonic Band has traveled throughout much of the United States, including two appearances at Carnegie Hall. John Rockwell, music critic of The New York Times, called the band "remarkably accomplished" and termed their program "a refreshing change from our own provincial concert fare". In 1992 they performed for a record eighth time at The Texas Music Educators Association convention in San Antonio. The band has commissioned works by Robert Linn, William Latham, Morton Gould, Anthony Vazzana, Norman Nelson, Larry Alan Smith, and Gerald Busby. They have produced two CDs and numerous record albums.

#### Dr. Keith Winking

Keith Winking, Coordinator of the Award winning Southwest Texas State University (SWT) Jazz Program and a member of the Southwest Brassworks, received his B.S. Degree from SWT, and his D.M.A degree in Trumpet Performance from the University of Texas at Austin. Under his direction the SWT Jazz ensemble has performed at numerous national and international festivals including the Montreaux, Notre Dame Collegiate, and Wichita Jazz Festivals. As a member of the Southwest Brassworks, he has presented concerts/clinics at leading music schools throughout the world, including the Crane School of Music, the St. Petersburg Conservatory (Russia), and in September of 1993 were artists-in-residence at the Moscow Conservatory. Dr. Winking is also a free-lance trumpet player performing with local groups such as the Austin Jazz Orchestra and the Austin Sinfonietta as well as national artists including James Brown, the Fabulous Thunderbirds, and the Four Tops. He has extensive recording experience and is currently staff trumpeter for Blacktop Records (New Orleans). Winking has also performed at many national festivals including the New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Festival and the Benson & Hedges Blues Festival.

#### Dr. Lawrence Weiner

Lawrence Weiner, a prolific composer of over 125 works has carved a special niche in the music world with his 38 compositions for symphonic band. Among his other notable works for large ensemble, he has written nine pieces for orchestra, four of them concertos and two for string orchestra; fifteen choral works; and 24 music chamber compositions for various soloists and chamber groups.

Weiner has received more than twenty commissions and awards from notable organizations such as ASCAP (1981 through 1992), five grants from Corpus Christi A&M University, other grants from public schools systems, band groups, and the Corpus Christi Symphony. Recently, two works have been nominated for the Pulitzer Prize (Concerto for Piano and Orchestra, and dialogues for Piano Trio). His over fifty published works (notably over thirty compositions by Southern Music Company) and hundreds of public performances all attest to the high degree that both professional musicians and his audiences have had for his music.

Weiner has bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Texas at Austin. After obtaining a Texas State teacher's Certificate at St. Mary's University in San Antonio and taking additional theory and composition work at Indiana University, Weiner earned his Doctorate from the University of Miami. He is currently a member of the music faculty at Corpus Christi A&M University.
