Key to Walks Grading System

Distance

S = short – under 5km M = medium – 5-10km L = long – over 10km

Terrain1-3 = Graded or open terrain, no scrub

4-7 = Bush, minor scrub, rainforest 8-10 = Rocks, creeks, rockhopping, scrambling,

thick scrub, major rock scrambling using hands, technical

Difficulty

1-3 = Easy, suitable for beginners 4-7 = Medium, reasonable fitness required 8-10 = Hard, strenuous, fit walkers only

Vegetation: Thick scrub, grass trees, wattles,

Expect: Meet at 10 Westlake Drive The Leap, where we will do a car shuttle to Tranquil Hill for the start of the walk.

A steady walk up the Northwestern side of The Leap, starting at Tranquil Hill (Morgan property). Walking and some short scrambles through scrub up to a rocky outcrop at the top of the ridge with views from Mount Dalrymple to Cape Hillsborough.

A nice spot to sit and take in the view with smoko. We will follow the ridge around to the Southeastern peak to take in views towards Mackay. We will then follow the more well know track down past the larger cliffs and finish in Westlake Drive.

All welcome to enjoy a hot or cold beverage at The Leap pub afterwards.

What to bring for the walk: Hat, backpack, water, lunch/snacks, insect repellent (scrub itch is bad at the moment) walking shoes, long clothing and gators are a good idea but not essential. The many grass trees mean lots of spiders so long clothing is recommended.

The west side of Flaggy Rock Bluff is a cliff face up to 80 metres high. We will walk around the base of the bluff to the south end, then climb to the top where we can overlook the ocean to the east, Mt Funnel to the north and hills to the west and south

Insect repellent is a must and remember to bring enough food and water for the whole day.

There were no injuries


We didn't lose anyone
