

**BRING
IT!** Your ID.
Your Vote.



This election, make your voice heard: **bring your photo ID to vote.**

Voters will be asked to show photo ID when voting in North Carolina.

Most voters will use their driver's license, but many other forms of photo ID will be accepted. Voters who vote by mail will be asked to include a photocopy of their ID when returning their ballot.

All voters will be allowed to vote with or without photo ID.

Voters who do not have photo ID when they vote can ensure their vote counts by either (1) filling out a form explaining why they are unable to show ID, or (2) showing their ID at their county board of elections office **by 5 p.m. November 14**, the ninth day after the election.



2024 General Election Calendar

- SEPT 6** County boards of elections begin mailing absentee ballots to eligible voters who submitted an absentee ballot request form.
- OCT 11** Voter registration deadline (5 p.m.)*
- OCT 17** In-person early voting begins; same-day registration available.
- OCT 29** Absentee ballot request deadline (5 p.m.)*
- NOV 2** In-person early voting ends (3 p.m.)

NOV 5 General Election Day

- NOV 5** Absentee ballot return deadline (7:30 p.m.)*

** Voter registration and absentee voting deadlines are different for military & overseas citizen voters.*

DON'T HAVE AN ACCEPTABLE PHOTO ID FOR VOTING?

Registered North Carolina voters who do not have an acceptable form of identification for voting purposes can **get a free photo ID** from their county board of elections office or free state ID card from the N.C. Division of Motor Vehicles (NCDMV).

Get a free voter ID in 3 simple steps.

1 Visit your county board of elections.

All county boards of elections can issue free voter photo IDs to registered voters in their county anytime during regular business hours.*

2 Provide your information.

To be issued an ID, provide your name, date of birth, and last four digits of your Social Security number. Then, you'll get your photo taken. No special documents are needed.

3 Get your ID.

The ID is typically given to you on the spot. If not, it can be mailed or scheduled for pickup. It will include your photo, name, and voter registration number.

*Except for the period between the end of early voting through the end of Election Day.
