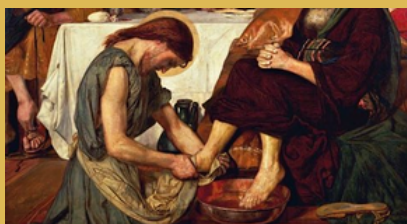

Dear parishioners,

In what I call the "Mary corner" of St. Patrick's church there several images of the Virgin Mary that are popular in different countries. Since we recently celebrated a feast day of Our Lady of Altagracia on January 21 and since Our Lady of Guadalupe is the patroness of the unborn, who we remembered in prayer on January 22, I thought I would share with you a story that has to do with these two images. Our Lady of Altagracia is the protectress of the Dominican Republic. I had the privilege of serving at a Mass in her honor here at St. Patrick's and then at the cathedral the next day. Each Mass provided a great opportunity to reflect on and give thanks for all that the Virgin Mary has done for us. At both of these Masses, I noticed very easily that several people were wearing the colors of the Dominican flag in honor of Our Lady. I noticed that even people who were not from the Dominican Republic were wearing that nation's colors because they knew they were celebrating the Virgin Mary. I guess, on the feast of Our Lady of Altagracia, we are all Dominicans. Seeing this reminded me of an experience I had attending a celebration for the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe at a different parish. I noticed one of the people in the parish that I knew was wearing a dress with the colors of the Mexican flag. So, to strike up a conversation, I asked her if she was from Mexico. She said: "No, I am from El Salvador, but...." And then she pointed at the statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe. She was wearing those colors in honor of Our Lady, who is the patroness of Mexico. I guess, on the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe, we are all Mexicans. These celebrations reminded me that Mary is the Mother of us all, no matter where we come from. She is not only the mother of different countries on earth, but the Mother of heaven, where we all belong. By wearing the colors of the flag of the country where a particular Marian devotion is especially popular, the people I saw were being witnesses to unity. They were showing respect for that country, giving honor to the Virgin Mary, and celebrating how we are all one human family under the care of the same Mother. How beautiful!

Our Lady of Altagracia, pray for us, Our Lady of Guadalupe, patroness of the unborn, pray for us. Blessings, Matthew

Gospel: Mk 1:14-20

A ONCE POWERFUL FRAME

The day they had dreaded for many months finally came. Son and daughter could no longer give their father the proper care and nursing support. Both had noticed the deterioration soon after their mother had died - the mix up in names, the forgetfulness, the sometimes-blank stare. Now he came out of his house, for what would be for the final time. The son fought back tears as he helped the once powerful frame to the waiting car. The old man's eyes seemed to focus in recognition of the gathered neighbors, but only momentarily. Soon the car moved off on its journey to the nursing home that had the facilities for coping with Alzheimer's Disease. Weeks later - coming toward Christmas - he was in the dining room and instinctively reached out to the accordion player, who was there for the Christmas sing-along. It was like he recognized a few chords and a hint of a smile returned. That simple incident provided a great deal of comfort for son and daughter. They remembered him play the accordion at weddings long before the acoustic groups took over. And they remembered too the sing-alongs in their home, so much a part of their growing up. The grandchildren were good to him. They took turns and visited him regularly. Even though he looked at them without any signals of recognition, they often took him by the hand for a walk in the garden. Maybe, thought the son as he watched the slow procession, maybe life is a journey from childhood to childhood, and in the case of his father at least, a journey from innocence to innocence regained. As they saw the old man with the grandchildren, son and daughter remembered the days when they went to the mountains with their dad. He always took them by the hand when the path became uncertain. Now in his final days, through the kindness of those who nursed him, God, they thought, was now taking the hand of their stumbling father and guiding him to heaven where memories would be restored again.

Free Income Tax Preparation (VITA)

IRS-certified volunteers at Amos House, a fully handicap-accessible agency at 460 Pine Street in Providence, prepare free income tax returns for those earning \$57,000 or less. There are two options: coming in for document drop-off and a safe-distance in-person interview, and fully electronic. For drop-off, appointments are required; they are available on Mondays and Wednesdays during the day and Tuesday and Thursday evenings, plus on selected Saturdays, by calling 401-272-0220. Completed returns available for pick-up within a week.

Electronic filers do not have to come in. More information on filing this way with Amos House and its partner GetYourRefund is available at www.amoshouse.org/freetaxprep. Other free tax sites in RI and MA may be found by calling the number 211.

Preparación gratuita de impuestos sobre la renta (VITA)

Voluntarios certificados por el IRS en Amos House, una agencia totalmente accesible para discapacitados en la 460 Pine Street en Providence, preparan declaraciones de impuestos gratuitas para aquellos que ganan \$ 57,000 o menos. Hay dos opciones: Llegar para la entrega de documentos o entrevista en persona a una distancia segura, y completamente electrónico. Para dejar los documentos, se requieren citas; estamos disponibles los lunes y miércoles durante el día y los martes y jueves por la noche, además algunos sábados ya seleccionados, llame al 401-272-0220. Devoluciones de sus taxes completos disponibles para recoger en una semana.

Los contribuyentes electrónicos no tienen que presentarse. Más información sobre cómo llenar sus formularios de income tax en esta forma con Amos House y su socio GetYourRefund está disponible en www.amoshouse.org/freetaxprep. Puede encontrar otros sitios de impuestos gratuitos en RI y MA llamando al número 211.
