FROM THE DESK OF OUR SEMINARIAN

Dear parishioners,

The readings for this Sunday have to do with the two basic principles of Christian ethics: love of God and love of neighbor. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches us about the two greatest commandments: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." In the first reading from Exodus, the Israelites are commanded to love their neighbor more specifically by treating foreigners and the poor with the dignity that is owed to them. It is a reading that challenges us in our modern day, and especially as we approach the elections, to be attentive to the experience of immigrants and the needs of the poor. The two greatest commandments are the foundation of Catholic Social Teaching. The Church gives us an extensive teaching on different social issues so that we can best fulfill the command to love our neighbor as ourselves. As Catholics in America in a time just before a major election, it is important that we familiarize ourselves with the principles of Catholic Social Teaching and let them guide us, especially as we prepare to vote. It is also important to pray that the Holy Spirit may guide us in our decisions and that those who will be elected will promote justice and peace. Perhaps then, we can see voting as an opportunity for us to love God and our neighbor. A few days ago, I discovered that the United States' Bishops released a "2020 Election Novena" for the nine days leading up to election day. The novena starts October 26, and involves praying an Our Father, a Hail Mary, and a Glory Be for the intention listed on each day. The intentions include prayers for voters, prayers for those who will be elected, and prayers for civility, racial justice, respect for the dignity of human life, and the protection of religious freedom in our country. It can be found on the USCCB website. This novena is a simple way in which we can apply our faith to the way we vote. By praying it, we can foster a greater desire to love God with all our heart and to love our neighbors as ourselves as election day approaches.

DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DE NUESTRO SEMINARISTA

Queridos feligreses,

Las lecturas de este Domingo tienen que ver con los dos patrones básicos de la ética cristiana: amor de Dios y amor del prójimo. En el Evangelio, Jesús nos enseña sobre los dos mandamientos principales: "Amarás al Señor tu dios con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma, con toda tu mente. Este es el primer mandamiento y el principal. El segundo es semejante al él: Amaras a tu prójimo como a ti mismo." En la primera lectura de Éxodo, se le comanda a los israelitas a amar a su prójimos más específicamente de tratar a los extranjeros y a los pobres con la dignidad que se les debe. Es una lectura que nos desafía en nuestro tiempo actual, y especialmente mientras acercamos a las elecciones, a estar atentos a la experiencia de los inmigrantes y las necesidades de los pobres. Los dos mandamientos principales son la fundación de la doctrina social de la Iglesia. La Iglesia nos da una enseñanza extensa sobre diferentes problemas sociales para que podamos cumplir mejor el mandato de amar a nuestro prójimo como a nosotros mismos. Como católicos en América en un tiempo no mucho antes de una elección grave, es importante que nos familiaricemos con los patrones de la doctrina social de la Iglesia y permitamos que nos guíen, especialmente, mientras nos preparamos a votar. También es importante rezar que el Espíritu Santo nos guie en nuestras decisiones y que todos los que sean elegidos promuevan justicia y paz. Entonces, podremos ver el votar como una oportunidad para nosotros de amar a Dios y al prójimo. Hace pocos días, descubrí que los obispos de los Estados Unidos publicaron una "Novena por las elecciones" por los nueve días antes del día de la elección. La novena empieza el 26 de octubre, e incluye la recitación de un Padre Nuestro, una Ave María, y un Gloria por la intención de cada día. Las intenciones contienen oraciones por los que votan, oraciones por los que serán elegidos, y oraciones por la civильdad, la justicia racial, respeto por la dignidad de la vida humana, y la protección de la libertad religiosa en nuestro país. Se puede encontrar la novena en español en el sitio web del USCCB. Esta novena es una manera simple en la que podemos aplicar nuestra fe a nuestra votación. Al rezarla, podemos cultivar un deseo mas grande de amar a Dios con todo el corazón y amar a nuestro prójimos como a nosotros mismos mientras se acerca el día de la elección.

BEYOND PRICE

What's the difference between a legalist and a lover? The legalist keeps score, the lover does not! Love thinks of how it might give more, do more, demonstrate more fully! There are many examples of people who are poor in pocket, but rich in love. More than anything else, God wants to be in a love relationship with His people. That's so evident from today's wonderful gospel (Matthew 22: 34-40).

He wants your love more than your obedience or service, because if you love God, you will automatically do those other things too. There was a debate in a parish once on whether the church was costing the people too much! An old wrinkled-faced man stood up and quietly told those gathered how 57 years previously a beautiful girl was born to him and his wife. From the very start, caring for her cost them, - in clothes, health-care, education! With college came fees and bank loans. She fell in love, and her wedding cost more than they would have thought. A year into the marriage, she fell ill and died. "Since we walked away from her grave," he said solemnly, "she hasn't cost them a penny." His remark? If you love someone or something, be it child or church, you'll give everything you have and won't mind. Only something dead is no longer expensive. So! Are you a legalist or lover, alive or dead in how you live your faith? Your life shapes your response to the Great Commandment.
