From the Desk of our Seminarian, Matthew Boni:

Dear parishioners,

The Saturdays of the month of July have been very special days for this parish community. We have seen several children make their first Holy Communion. We have also seen people receive Baptism, and last week, four adults received the sacrament of Confirmation at our church. On these joyous occasions, those that received these sacraments made a commitment to the beautiful Catholic faith that has been given to us. Those who are baptized as adults make baptismal promises saying they renounce sin and all of Satan's empty promises, and then they profess their belief in the truths of our faith.

Those who are confirmed renew their baptismal promises and make another profession of faith. Watching these candidates receive the sacraments reminded me how important it is for us to remember the truths of our faith and keep them at the center of our lives. We must always try to live our baptismal promises. This week, I remembered something a priest at my seminary would tell me after I would confess my sins to him. For my penance, he would often tell me to pray the Creed and the Gloria, which are significant parts of the Mass. *If you think about it, it really does make sense to pray*

the Creed and the Gloria in order to make up for our sins because when we sin we go against the truth of our faith. We might say we believe in what the Church teaches, but we don't always live like it. Every time we say the Creed at Sunday Mass, we renew our commitment to living according to what we believe. And the Gloria helps us to rejoice in those truths that we profess. By singing the Gloria, which our music ministers do so beautifully and joyfully, we are giving glory to God the Father, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit because of what we believe about how great they are. I invite you this week to reflect on the words of the Gloria and the Creed and to pray them sincerely, especially during Mass. With all our heart, let us give thanks for the faith we have, joyfully profess it, and renew our commitment to live by it. God Bless you – Matthew Boni

Reverend and dear Monsignor/Father:

I am very sorry to announce that the **Annual Wedding Anniversary Mass**, scheduled for the Cathedral of SS. Peter and Paul on Sunday, September 27th, will have to be cancelled. The Wedding Anniversary Mass is one of the largest and most joyful events in the life of the Diocese, but the need to cancel is unavoidable. Every year the Mass draws a large number of couples (and their families), to the Cathedral for Holy Mass and a reception, but many of the attendees are advanced in age. The risks to the health of the participants would be significant.

It is certainly our hope and our expectation that the Wedding Anniversary Mass will be scheduled again next year.

In the meantime, we are still eager to recognize those couples in the Diocese of Providence who are celebrating significant wedding anniversaries this year. If you are aware of couples in your parish who are celebrating special anniversaries, (e.g., 25, 40, 50, 60 years or more), and would like them to be recognized, please send their names and mailing addresses and the number of years they are celebrating to my office, via regular mail or email, and I will be very happy to send them a personal letter and a signed certificate.

Thank you for your attention to this announcement and for your continuing pastoral care of your people. Together we look forward to and pray for that day when our normal pastoral activities can resume without disruption or fear.

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Gospel MT 14:13-21

When Jesus heard of the death of John the Baptist, he withdrew in a boat to a deserted place by himself. The crowds heard of this and followed him on foot from their towns. When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, and he cured their sick. When it was evening, the disciples approached him and said, "This is a deserted place and it is already late; dismiss the crowds so that they can go to the villages and buy food for themselves." Jesus said to them, "There is no need for them to go away; give them some food yourselves." But they said to him, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have here." Then he said, "Bring them here to me," and he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing, broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, who in turn gave them to the crowds. They all ate and were satisfied, and they picked up the fragments left over—twelve wicker baskets full. Those who ate were about five thousand men, not counting women and children.

Todos comieron hasta saciarse, y con los pedazos que habían sobrado, se llenaron doce canastos. Los que comieron eran unos cinco mil hombres, sin contar a las mujeres y a los niños.

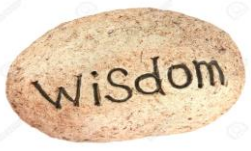

THE ASSUMPTION

On November 1st 1950 Pope Pius XII proclaimed the doctrine of the Assumption: “The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory.” In advancing the Assumption as infallible teaching, the Catholic Church, some said, had widened the ecumenical breach with other Christian communions. The church from earliest times taught that Mary, because of her unique calling, was a model for us all, - women *and* men. She is most assessable to us if we see the doctrines describing her as also about us! As she was prepared for her intimate relationship with Christ by the Immaculate Conception, so are we at the moment of Baptism. As she consented to conceive, carry and give birth to the Word in the World, so must we. And if she is now risen with him, so will we be. Her assumption, like Jesus’ ascension, is not about her being taken away, but about the completeness of her transformation. And like Jesus, because she now transcends the parameters of her historical existence, she is more present to us here and now than we can possibly imagine. Mary’s assumption frees her to enter the world to proclaim her Magnificat to the oppressed and those victimized by power. “The mighty shall be pulled down from their thrones, and the rich sent empty away.” She is the Pieta throughout the Third World, every mother holding a dead child, every parent desperate for food, clothing, shelter, education, medicine and hope for their children. How much easier for us if Mary could be contained in our churches, a soothing object of devotion. Out in the world she is much more challenging. In the Assumption, as is always the case in these matters, no doctrine can encompass the mystery. The mystery of Mary is our mystery, our hope and our challenge.
