From the Desk of our Seminarian, Matthew Boni:

Dear parishioners,

This week, August 15th, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, in which we remember that the Mother of God was assumed, body and soul, into heaven where she is now praying for us. In this time when there are many hardships in our lives on earth, this great solemnity invites us to turn our attention to the life that we await in heaven where there is always peace, love, and no threat of evil. Where Our Lady is now, we hope to be one day. Reflecting on the Assumption, I thought about an experience I had when I was in Argentina during my junior year of college. I went on a pilgrimage with a group from a parish in Buenos Aires. It was a pilgrimage on foot from the capital city of Buenos Aires to the city of Lujan, which is a 43-mile journey. In Lujan there is a shrine, the Basilica of Our Lady of Lujan, where a small miraculous statue of Our Lady of Lujan, the patroness of Argentina, is kept. At some point in the trip, we had finished a break time and were about to resume the trek to the basilica, when in the midst of the very large crowd of pilgrims, I heard a voice of someone from afar that said: "Vamos. La Virgen nos espera" (Let's get going. The Virgin is waiting for us). Hearing these words made me think about how we are all pilgrims making a pilgrimage to heaven. Our whole life that we live on earth is a pilgrimage toward heaven because, as Catholics, we live each day with the hope of obtaining the eternal life that Jesus won for us. This week then we can direct our attention to our final destination: heaven. The solemnity of the Assumption reminds us that the Virgin Mary has already arrived at this destination and is there now helping us and guiding us on our earthly pilgrimage. She wants us to live with her in glory. We should implore her intercession so that we may arrive where she is now. Our Mother is in heaven. We are on pilgrimage. And she is waiting for us.



If the rosary is not a part of your regular prayer life right now, it's easy to get your feet wet with this devotion. Here is one step to get started.

We don't have to pray the rosary all at once. Sure, some people might sit down and quietly pray a whole rosary in one sitting. But we can also choose to divide it up, saying just a decade or two at a time at different points throughout the day: on the way to work, in between errands, in between meetings, while folding laundry or doing dishes. Many holy men and women and even popes have prayed the rosary this way and have found it manageable and fruitful for their busy lives. Try it...

DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DE NUESTRO SEMINARISTA, MATEO BONI: Queridos feligreses,

En esta semana, 15 de agosto, celebramos la solemnidad de la Asunción de la Virgen María, en la cual recordamos que La Madre de Dios ascendió, cuerpo y alma, al cielo donde ella está ahora pidiendo por nosotros. En este tiempo cuando hay muchas dificultades en la vida aquí en la tierra, esta gran solemnidad nos invita a girar la atención a la vida que esperamos al cielo donde siempre hay paz, amor, y ninguna amenaza de mal. Donde Nuestra Señora está ahora, nosotros esperamos llegar un día. Al reflexionar sobre la Asunción, pensé en una experiencia que tuve cuando estaba en Argentina durante mi tercer año en la universidad. Fui en una peregrinación con un grupo de una parroquia en Buenos Aires. Fue una peregrinación a pie desde la ciudad de Buenos Aires a la ciudad de Luján, la cual es un camino de 43 millas. En Luján hay un santuario, la Basílica de Nuestra Señora de Luján, donde se mantiene una pequeña estatua milagrosa de Nuestra Señora de Luján, la patrona de Argentina. En algún momento en el viaje, habíamos terminado un tiempo de descanso y estábamos a punto de resumir la caminata hacia la basílica cuando, en el medio de la gran muchedumbre de peregrinos, escuché una voz de una persona que



estaba lejos que dijo: "Vamos. La Virgen nos espera." Oír estas palabras me hizo pensar sobre como todos somos peregrinos haciendo una peregrinación al cielo. Toda la vida que vivimos en la tierra es una peregrinación hacia el cielo porque, como católicos, vivimos cada día siempre con la esperanza de obtener la vida eterna que Jesús nos ganó. Esta semana entonces podemos dirigir nuestra atención a nuestro destino final: el cielo. La solemnidad de la asunción nos recuerda que la Virgen María ya ha llegado a este destino y está allí ahora ayudándonos y guiándonos en nuestra peregrinación terrenal. Ella quiere que vivamos juntos a ella en gloria. Debemos implorar entonces su intercesión para que lleguemos donde ella está ahora. Nuestra Madre está en el cielo. Nosotros estamos en peregrinación. Y ella nos espera.

Muchos hombres y mujeres santos e incluso papas han rezado el rosario de esta manera y lo han encontrado manejable y fructífero para sus vidas ocupadas. Intentalo...**

Reverend and dear Monsignor/Father:

I am very sorry to announce that the **Annual Wedding Anniversary Mass**, scheduled for the Cathedral of SS. Peter and Paul on Sunday, September 27th, will have to be cancelled. The Wedding Anniversary Mass is one of the largest and most joyful events in the life of the Diocese, but the need to cancel is unavoidable. Every year the Mass draws a large number of couples (and their families), to the Cathedral for Holy Mass and a reception, but many of the attendees are advanced in age. The risks to the health of the participants would be significant.

It is certainly our hope and our expectation that the Wedding Anniversary Mass will be scheduled again next year.

In the meantime, we are still eager to recognize those couples in the Diocese of Providence who are celebrating significant wedding anniversaries this year. If you are aware of couples in your parish who are celebrating special anniversaries, (e.g., 25, 40, 50, 60 years or more), and would like them to be recognized, please send their names and mailing addresses and the number of years they are celebrating to my office, via regular mail or email, and I will be very happy to send them a personal letter and a signed certificate.

Thank you for your attention to this announcement and for your continuing pastoral care of your people. Together we look forward to and pray for that day when our normal pastoral activities can resume without disruption or fear.




