

Testimony of Grace



My name is Joe C. and I'm 57 years old. I'm originally from the southern part of New Hampshire. My childhood growing up there appeared pretty normal on the outside. I was in church with my Mom and Little League with my dad. Everything seemed like a typical life.

I wasn't that old when I started to realize the brokenness of that home. There was excessive drinking and a dad that traveled, more and more, for “work”. He was rarely home. When he was around, it was “cool” to have a sip off of the beers I would bring him. Soon, I was helping myself to those beers and then, his hard liquor. By age 14, I was a daily drinker, which led me through the progression of something harder until I was age 18; drugs. I developed a cocaine addiction that would stay with me for over 25 years.

For most of those years using drugs, I considered myself as a “functional addict”. I made decent career choices in life, was married twice, helped raise my second wife's two daughters to be successful women, bought a house, and owned many “worldly” possessions. But, I also lived very selfishly and recklessly. I survived multiple incidents including many possible arrests, several car wrecks, a motorcycle accident, and two overdoses; all of which should have proven fatal.

In my mid-forties, this “functional addict” realized he was out of control. I found myself in my first, of many, secular rehabs. Eventually, after losing everything of this world, the Lord led me to a faith-based rehab in Manchester, New Hampshire. I did very well there while developing a close relationship with Jesus Christ. I thought I had completely given my life to Him and surrendered. Because of what I considered, at the time as personal offenses, I took back my own will. After three years, I left the safety of that community of faith.

I moved to Jacksonville, North Carolina and by not knowing anyone there, I began to isolate. I fell away from God and went back to the bottle. That was the beginning of another slide into darkness.

Regardless of my mistakes and disobedience, the Lord is faithful and merciful! He led me to Open Door Ministries where I was able to rekindle my prayer life and my relationship with Jesus. I was able to fall back into a life of structure and surrounded by men of God.

I have been truly blessed and thankful to be here. I believe the Lord has brought me here for a purpose. Though I may not completely understand the path He has laid in front of me, I have heard His voice, yet again, and this time I pray He gives me the strength to listen and the clarity to understand.

The verse I stand on is **Jeremiah 29:11**;

“For I know the plans I have for you,” says the Lord. “They are plans for good and not disaster, to give you a future and a hope.”
