## **Show Rules and Regulations**

**Entries:** This show is open to all horses registered with NAPHA (formerly PPHRNA & AAOBPPH) or the PHAC. Horses must be entered based upon the current registration papers, registered owner and full registered name and number. Horses must be entered under the full registered name.

Male horses 4 years of age and older must be registered as a stallion or gelding. Registration papers indicating "male" will not be considered acceptable registration papers. The only exception will be male horses entered in Colts 3-4 in Bozal. Spayed mares may not be shown as breeding mares.

**Proof of ownership:** A copy of the horse's current Registration papers MUST accompany Entry Form. Entries cannot be processed without them.

**Post Entries:** Are accepted by the Show Secretary 1/2 hour before classes start in the mornings. Be sure to bring paperwork for post entries.

**Scratching/Withdrawing Entry:** SSPPHC and SWPHC agree to refund entry fees on any horse that is physically unable to compete, provided a Veterinary Statement certifying inability to compete is received in the Show office 3 classes prior to the class the horse has been entered. Other entries must be scratched 3 classes prior to their respective classes in order to have fees refunded.

**Adding Classes:** There will be no additional charge other than normal class fees for adding classes to a horse already entered.

**Refunds:** Refunds cannot be made without valid written veterinary excuse. NO refunds will be approved after the closing of the show.

**Substituting:** In the event your horse is unable to compete, another eligible horse from the same ranch may be substituted without additional charge.

**Responsibility:** All entries are accepted with the understanding that NAPHA, SSPPHC, SWPHC and Stevens County Expo will not be held responsible for any loss, personal injury or damage to horses exhibited or for any injury that may be occasioned to any person or any animal or damage to any property while on the grounds by any horse owned or exhibited by him and shall indemnify the management against all claims



*or damages of any kind or nature, including attorney fees and court costs that may grow out of any injury occasioned by any horse owned or exhibited by him/her or arising from the negligence of the person in charge of any such horse.*

***All Exhibitors, Handlers, Riders and Other Persons*** participating in this show are responsible for a thorough knowledge of and are subject to the current NAPHA Official Rules & Regulations of Horse Showing & Peruvian Paso Breed Standards, NAPHA Official Rules & Regulations of Registration & By-Laws. Remember, NO advertising on shirts. All showing procedures and judging percentages as well as definitions, class descriptions of gear and attire, rules and regulations, conduct and ethics, and conditions for this show are described in the above-named publications. ***Amateur Status:*** Anyone competing in a class or division declared for Amateurs only must have a written Amateur Declaration on file with the NAPHA. NEW RULES ARE IN PLACE FOR AMATEURS AND NOVICES - READ PAGE 11.

***Amateur Owner to Ride (AOTR):*** Rider must be amateur and registered owner of the horse.

***Juniors:*** Juniors are those individuals who have not yet reached their eighteenth (18th) birthday. For horse show purposes, the age of an individual on January 1 of the current year shall be maintained throughout the entire show year. Junior classes 12 and younger and 13 and older will run together as a single class, but will be judged separately. Retranças are not allowed. Florons are acceptable. Juniors may only ride mares and geldings. Helmets are required for 6-12 and lead line and are encouraged for 13-18.

***All Additions, Scratches, Changes of Rider/Handler, Tack Changes Must Be submitted to the Show Office On the Official Form Three (3) Classes Prior. An Official Change/Request is included in your exhibitor's packet.***

## **NEW: IMPORTANT --- Breeding Mare & Stallions**

*National or returning Champion of Champions and any horse that has qualified for Champion and Reserve Breeding Mare or Breeding Stallion classes MUST ENTER their respective Zootecnico class on Sunday.*

*The Show Secretary will automatically enter all national returning Champions and this show's first and second place class winners into their respective Zootecnico class. It is not required that a first or second place enter the Ch. and Res. Class. The Show Secretary must be notified before the time **class 46** is called if a horse will not be competing in the Zootecnico, Ch and Res or Ch of Ch class that day.*

*No refunds will be given for the Zootecnico or Ch and Res classes if the Show Secretary is not notified before the time **class 46** is called. See the Refund Policy for additional information.*

*There will be no stripping of tack during Champion of Champions classes.*

**Novice Class:** *Anyone competing in a class or Division declared for "Novice" only must have a signed NAPHA Novice Declaration on file with the NAPHA. Novices must file this form annually. An exhibitor (18 years and older) can compete in the Novice Division for a period of 3 years. If the Novice, at the end of 3 years, has not competed in more than 8 NAPHA-approved shows during that period, they may extend the time period for another 3 years (double shows count as one show). However, if at any time, a Novice competes and wins a Champion title in gait, breeding or performance (any other division above the level of Novice) they will be immediately excluded from competing in the Novice Division at future shows.*

**Owner:** *The name on the certificate of ownership issued by the NAPHA, and their minor children are allowed to ride AAOBPPH, PPHRNA, or PHAC,. If the horse is owned by a ranch, corporation or a family trust, the individuals' names must be registered with the NAPHA.*

## **Stalling With Someone Else:**

*If you wish to be stalled next to someone, indicate so on the Entry Form. We will do our best to honor all stall requests. Please advise us of your stalling preferences on your Entry Form. Also, please note whether you prefer stalls on concrete or those with dirt floors on your Entry Form. Be advised that there are a limited number of stalls with concrete floors.*

**Early Arrival and Late Departure:** *This facility can accommodate arrivals after 12:00 noon on Thursday, May 25, 2022.*

## **All Stalls Are To Be Vacated By 10:00am on Monday, May 29, 2023.**

**Shavings:** *Exhibitors are required to purchase all shavings at the Stephens County Expo. NO outside shavings are allowed. Pre-ordered shavings can be at your stalls if requested on your Entry Form. All shavings will be billed on your show invoice.*

**Items To Bring To the Show:** *Exhibitors are advised to bring all items necessary for the showing and care of their horses such as feed and water buckets, hay feeders, feed, hay, supplements, grooming supplies, fans, garden hose, stable fork, fly spray, etc... Bring tack room equipment such as saddle racks, head gear hooks, broom, folding chairs, wheelbarrow, muck bucket, ice chest, etc....*

**Drug Free Show:** *This is a Drug-Free show and will be run under the rules and guidelines of the USEF. You can access all the pertinent information at [www.usef.org](http://www.usef.org). Be advised that Bute and Banamene are specifically referenced in the USEF literature as being illegal drugs in the show setting.*

**Lead-Line:** *This class is open to children 6 years of age and younger. Tack and attire will be the same as for all regular classes.*

**Everything is Being Done** to conduct this show at the highest level and for the pleasure of exhibitors and spectators. The best adjudication officials to be found have been selected and they will award placement to the horses as they see them presented in the ring, without regard for previous records or performances. The SSPPHC and SWPHC are desirous of fair treatment for all exhibitors and in return ask for the cooperation of all in helping to make this show a successful and enjoyable event.

**Call for Classes:** Classes will be called promptly and with advance notice. Exhibitors shall present themselves to the gate steward in a timely manner to facilitate preparations for the class. After the first horse enters the arena, remaining entries will have 5 minutes to enter prior to closing of the gate. While this is usually sufficient, exhibitors requiring a tack change may request it in advance. Approval of the tack change adds an additional 2 minutes - for a total of 7 minutes after the first horse enters the ring. The gate will remain open during this time or until all entries have entered the arena. No judging will occur while the gate is open, although the Judge may observe the general condition of the horses in the arena.

**Conduct:** Each exhibitor while on the show grounds will display his horse in the most natural way possible and maintain his/her horse in a suitable manner. Exhibitors shall at all times take whatever steps are necessary to protect themselves, their horses and the viewing public. The Show Management reserves to itself the right to remove a groom, horse, rider or handler from the show without being liable for compensation or damages. It is mandatory for a Judge or a Show Steward to dismiss any rider or handler (and his/her horse) who deliberately interferes with another entry or who displays unsportsmanlike behavior in the arena or within sight of the spectators at the arena. It should also be noted that no warnings are ever necessary. \*\*\*Part IX, Section 15, NAPHA Show Rules\*\*\*

### *Judging Guidelines*

*\*\*\*Judges will use current NAPHA rules to arrive at their decision\*\*\**

***Gait Division:*** *to be judged 100% on Gait.*

***Conformation Division:*** *to be judged 100% on Conformation.*

***Breeding Division:*** *to be judged 41% Gait, 27% Conformation, 27% Brio & Temperament, 5% Condition.*

***Bozal Division:*** *to be judged 40% Gait, 35% Conformation, 30% Brio & Temperament, 5% Condition*

***Halter Division:*** *to be judged 30% Gait, 45% Conformation, 20% Brio & Temperament, 5% Condition.*

***Performance Division:*** *to be judged 50% on Performance, Brio, Suitability & Manners, 40% Gait, 10% Condition.*

***The Elements of Gait are: Function, Smoothness, Elasticity and Ornaments***

***Function*** *is the Refinement of Gait, Efficiency or Quality of Gait, Harmony and Cadence.*

***Smoothness*** *is the absence of vertical movement with quiet hock action as long as it does not stem from Weakness.*

***Elasticity*** *is a horse's ability to execute a perfect gait at different speeds.*

*At the same Quality of Gait, the faster horse is better. But at Judge's discretion, Quality of Gait may count more than speed. Having better quality of gait, the horse that increases the length of his stride to gain speed, and less quality of gait is the horse that increases the number of steps to gain speed.*

***Ornaments*** *is the combination of Termino, Lift and Extension. In all divisions, the best horse is the one with the highest average of all attributes, not the horse that excels at one.*

**NAPHA Rules and Regulations for Showing**  
**Section 15 - CONDUCT**

***It is a violation of the show rules to commit any act or to make remarks in connection with the show that are considered offensive or made with intent to influence , or cast aspersions on, the character or integrity of the officials. Any exhibitor may be barred from the show for this offense.***

***Exhibitors are warned that any of the following may result in disqualification of the horse(s), removal from the show and show grounds facility, and the disciplinary actions of the NAPHA, including, but not limited to, warnings, fines, suspension and/or expulsion:***

- a.) An act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of an owner, trainer, groom, rider, handler, or member of the family of persons participating in the show;***
- b.) Public verbal abuse of competition officials;***
- c.) Physical assault upon a person and/or cruelty to a horse (as defined in USEF rules);***
- d.) Failure to obey a penalty imposed by the NAPHA;***
- e.) Exhibiting a horse that is in the care, training, or custody of a suspended or expelled owner or trainer;***
- f.) Riding, exhibiting, coaching, or training for the benefit, credit, reputation, or satisfaction of a suspended or expelled person;***
- g.) Failure to pay all debts to the NAPHA or a NAPHA approved show.***

## ***Class Descriptions***

***Class Routine:*** Horses enter the ring at their best gait, lining up in the center in front of the Judge or Ring Steward for inspection. The inspection in the line is for conformation and condition.

***Champagne Class:*** The rider with the most liquid remaining in his/her glass at the end of the class is the winner. The horses must gait - not walk. Optional exercises can be implemented to add to the enjoyment of the class. Ties can be broken with an additional exercise. Ponchos are optional. Bit or bozal.

### ***Champion and Champion of Champions Classes:***

Champions and Champion of Champions from shows other than Sooner State or the National show must qualify to enter the Championship classes at this show. Returning Champion of Champions not participating in any other classes at this show must pay \$65 entry fee.

***Adult Attire:*** Ladies: a white or cream-colored mid-calf to ankle-length riding skirt may be substituted for white pants. Sidesaddle attire: See NAPHA rules. Dress/habits should be conservative and appropriate for equestrian events - not dances or costume balls.

***Junior Attire:*** White pants, white shirt, black or brown boots and belts, hats either Peruvian or other straw type hat. Riders ages 12 & under, and leadline are required to wear helmets, with bicycle-type helmets being acceptable. Helmets are highly recommended for ages 13-18. Vests and Blazers are allowed for all classes. Ponchos are allowed in classes other than equitation. On any horse ridden in Peruvian tack by a Junior in ANY class: retrancas are prohibited, baticola is required and floron is optional.

***Junior Qualifying Ages:*** Juniors are those individuals who have not yet reached their eighteenth birthday. For horse show purposes, the age of an individual on January 1 shall be maintained throughout the entire show year. Persons born on January 1 shall assume the greater age on that date. The leadline classes are exceptions, wherein a child must have attained the age of 24 months before the show. The minimum age for participation in other Junior classes is set at 6 years.

***Bareback:*** Bareback pads without stirrups are allowed in bareback classes.

**Barrida of Champions:** Includes all Champions, Champion of Champions, Best Gaited, Best Bozal, Hi Point Breeder, High Point Amateur Exhibitor, High Point AOTR Exhibitor, High Point Novice, (High Point Junior 13 yrs and over may participate with parents' consent)

**Stakes Payout:** The purse will be 80% of the gate entry fees, with 1st place - 30%, 2nd place - 25%, 3rd place - 15%, 4th place 10%. (Amateurs are allowed to accept prize money, "AS THE OWNER OF A HORSE IN ANY CLASS OTHER THAN EQUITATION OR SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES") (as per NAPHA Show Rules)

**Tack:** Work saddles and flat bridles may be used if clean and in good condition. \*\*\*\*\*Spurs of BUMPER type are permitted in all classes for Juniors.\*\*\*\*\*

**Lead Line Class:** This class is open to children 6 years of age and younger. Tack and attire will be the same as for all regular classes.

**Ladies to Ride Class:** Entries may be asked to perform movements such as stop, back up, circle once or twice in gait, reverse and serpentine through cones.

**AOTR, Novice, Bozal High Point Awards:** At least 3 classes in the Division must be entered to qualify for these awards. In the case of a tie, the horse/rider with the highest placement in the Gait class will be declared the winner.

**NAPHA Rules** Pertaining to Amateur/Professional and Novice Rules: Anyone competing in a class or Division declared for "Amateurs" only must have a signed NAPHA Amateur Declaration on file with the NAPHA. Amateurs must file annually. Regardless of one's equestrian skills and/or accomplishments, a person is an amateur if after their 18th birthday, they have not engaged in any of the activities identified in PART X Glossary of Terms, Section 10 Professional, of the NAPHA Show Rules. Every person who has reached his/her 18th birthday and competes in classes for amateurs under NAPHA rules must be listed on the NAPHA website as an Amateur or have signed a NAPHA Amateur Declaration filed with the show secretary, prior to the start of the show that morning of the class entered. Amateur status will be issued only on receipt of the application properly signed and is revocable at any time for cause. Any person who has not reached his/her 18th birthday is an amateur and does not require amateur status. See Part X GLOSSARY OF TERMS for complete definition of Amateur and Professional, in the NAPHA show rules.



**Optional**  
**SPECIAL TACK AND ATTIRE**  
*For All Novice and Amateur Classes*

*To promote participation and allow competitors to try something other than the normal white attire, we have developed guidelines for other-color clothing in any Novice or Amateur Class. This is NOT mandatory, rather an option for those who would like to try something different!*

***If you decide to ride with alternative Tack and Attire, please follow the below specified rules:***

*Approved clothing colors: Black, shades of grey (charcoal to light), browns (dark to tan/beige, khaki), shades of muted greens (olive to hunter), small pinstripes, light blue or dark navy, burgundy (no bright reds), white, creams, ivory.*

*--- Hat: Must be of Peruvian type as currently outlined in NAPHA rules unless matching an attire such as Western.*

*--- No ponchos: Blazer or Suit-style Vest MUST be worn, if wearing alternative attire.*

*--- Boots &\* Belt: In colors and type as currently outlined in the NAPHA rules. Boots allowed to be worn outside of pants. Polinas allowed in same range of colors.*

*--- Alternative Color Vests/Jackets allowed in colors as outlined above.*

*--- Shirts: Collared, long-sleeved shirt in white or colors as outlined above.*

*--- Slacks/Pants: must be sufficiently long enough to cover ankle and boot tops unless the boots are being worn outside of the pants. Jeans in above solid colors. Please, no casual looking blue jeans.*

*--- Split skirts or sidesaddle aprons for women: As provided for in NAPHA rules, also in above colors.*

*--- Scarves &\* Ties: Traditional white scarf, Peruvian style, bolo tie, or Western crisscross tie in above outlined colors; or necktie and brooch. Spurs are optional and must be of the Peruvian type if used, unless to match other tack style. Juniors may wear Bumper type spurs only.*

# Shaving/Trimming of the Vibrissae

Regarding shaving/trimming of the vibrissae (tactile hairs = “whiskers”) on the muzzle and around the eyes of horses. Some European countries have banned this practice to include disqualification for shaved horses. These policies take effect in July of 2021. The USEF is also involved in the review of these practices in conjunction with the FEI (Federation Equestre International).

As we have more of our members/exhibitors who agree with this policy, NAPHA is making a recommendation that exhibitors who choose not to shave the vibrissae will not be penalized for doing so.

For this show: All horses shall be clean, neatly trimmed, in good flesh presenting a healthy appearance and outfitted in clean and appropriate tack. Exhibitors will not be penalized if they choose not to trim or shave the vibrissae around the eyes and muzzle.

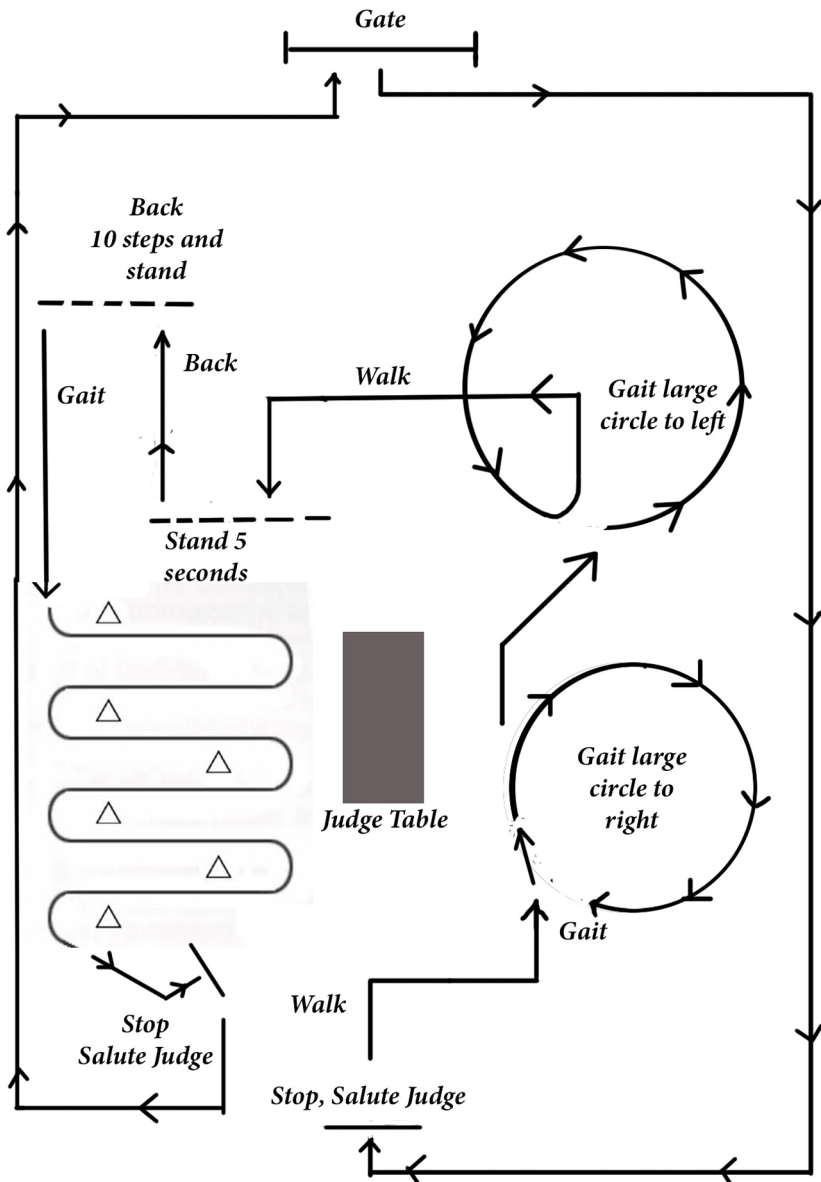
