Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

What is the application due date?

We are thrilled you are interested in applying to be a part of the MD-CRUSE Project. The application due date is February 28, 2021.

What is the expected time commitment for participation in this project?

MD-CRUSE is a time efficient project that spans three years. The time commitment varies by year and is as follows:

- Year 1: 10 hrs./month (Mar. – May); and 40 hrs. during the summer of 2021
- Year 2: 10 hrs./month (Sept. – May); and 40 hrs. during the summer of 2022
- Year 3: ~2 hrs./every other month (Sept. – May); 24 hrs. during the summer of 2023

Please note: The time commitment in year three depends upon the research project your team will undertake. There will be time devoted to data collection, analysis, and reporting in year three. That time will be determined by your role on and contribution to your research team.

We recognize that this is a significant time commitment, and in return you will have an opportunity to hone your research skill, and collaborate on research projects that will be disseminated and influence the field of Urban STEM Education. We have designed the project to ensure maximum benefit for the time commitment.

When will applicants be notified of the participation decision?

Applicants will be notified by mid-March 2021.
