Introduction

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

First Year Courses

Old Testament Survey 101 & 102

Together these two courses survey the entire Old Testament over 2 quarters. Students will learn the historical and theological foundation to the great ideas of the Bible-creation, transgression, redemption, and consummation. The three main genres of the Old Testament (narrative, poetry, and prophecy) will be studied along with the significance of the great eschatological covenants (Abrahamic, Davidic, Palestinian, and New) and Israel's place in God's plan. The student will behold the faithfulness of God toward Israel and be introduced to the nature and love of God. They will be introduced to the purpose of the Law and its typology and witness the unfolding of the Messianic anticipation and cultivate a worshipful heart.

New Testament Survey - 101 & 102

This course surveys the entire New Testament over 2 quarters. The purpose of this course is to provide an overview of the New Testament from Matthew through Revelation and includes a brief background study of the inter-testament period between Malachi of the Old Testament and Matthew of the New Testament. The overview includes authorship, historical setting, purposes and themes, and other pertinent information, all working together to place each book in its own setting and clarifying its thought and message.

Bible Doctrines - 101 & 102

This is a two-quarter course in which several Bible doctrines will be covered including, the doctrine of God, doctrine of

Christ, Doctrine of Man, Sin, Salvation, Doctrine of End Times, Predestination, and others.

Principles of Leadership - 101,102,103,104

These courses provide students an introduction to the basic principles of Biblical leadership. Each course covers foundational Biblical principles of leadership to prepare students to be an effective leader by learning to lead like Jesus.

Foundations of Faith - 101,102,103, & 104

This is a 4-quarter course with an in-depth study of faith and how to live by faith. Hebrews 11:6 says, "Without faith it is impossible to please God." In this course, students are taught what the faith of the believer is and what it is not, how faith is obtained, the basic elements of faith, and how to use their faith to accomplish the purposes of God

New Creation Realities -

This course will teach you who you are in Christ and all the benefits at your disposal given to you through the authority in the name of Jesus. You will see yourself as the champion Christ made you to be no longer walking in defeat.

Believers Authority -

This course is designed to equip the student to understand and operate under the authority given to us by Christ. The student will learn from scripture the nature of Christ's provision for us and our authority under His Lordship to function as Kings and priests.

How to be Led by the Spirit -

This course will teach students how to know the voice of God and how to be led by the Spirit of God.

Growing Up Spiritually –

This course will examine the value and necessity of spiritual growth. It will prove by the teachings and examples in the New Testament, that growing up in Christ

is the key to fulfilling our God-given potential.

Renewing the Mind -

This course is designed to give the student a biblical perspective on the importance of renewing the mind with understanding into his/her position in Christ in order to mature in the things of God and to manifest Christlikeness to the world.

Character of God -

This course is an examination of the Old Testament Hebrew names of God, which give revelation into the character of God. Jesus will be seen as the incarnate expression of these names and the one who is the same yesterday, today, and forever. The revelation into the unchanging nature and character of God will strengthen your faith as you discover the awesomeness of our God.

Gifts & Callings -

This course is designed to identify the gifts and callings that God has placed within each student. Students will learn about the ministry gifts present in the Body of Christ and how each person is uniquely created for a specific purpose in their lives.

Principles of Prayer -

This course covers the biblical principles of prayer, and prayer ministry in the church. It addresses God's purposes in prayer, connecting to the heart of God in the secret place, the different types of prayer, and how to pray. The student will learn how to develop a personal lifestyle of prayer.

Fruit of the Spirit

This course covers the nine different fruits of the Spirit in the context of Paul's letter to the Galatians. Students will learn the difference between the gifts of the spirit and the fruits of the Spirit. We will discuss each of the fruits in depth and compare the fruit of the Spirit to the works of the flesh and explore how the fruit of the Spirit is meant to be lived out within the body of

Book of Romans – chapter by chapter

This course is an in-depth exegetical study of the Book of Romans, in order to examine its doctrines relating to the Gospel. As such, the course will include the study of how both Jew and Gentile need to be made right with God, the gospel of righteousness, the doctrines of justification, sanctification, and glorification, as well as, the place of Israel in the Plan of God. The course will conclude, as does the book of Romans, with a study of issues regarding the practical Christian life.

FIRST YEAR OBJECTIVE

Students who complete the first year of The Bible School of Leadership will know who they are in Christ, know God's purpose for their life, and have a solid Biblical worldview that will prepare them to engage their culture and world as a leader for Christ and the Kingdom of God. They will know how to apply key Biblical principles of life and be prepared for the Second Year of the Bible School of Leadership.
