Significant Growth in Referrals

Since 2021, SUSO has seen a remarkable rise in referral intakes, growing by more than 50%. This increase highlights our expanding reach and the growing trust within the community to support those in need of our services.

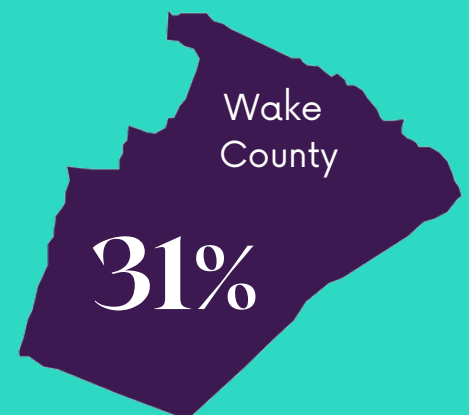
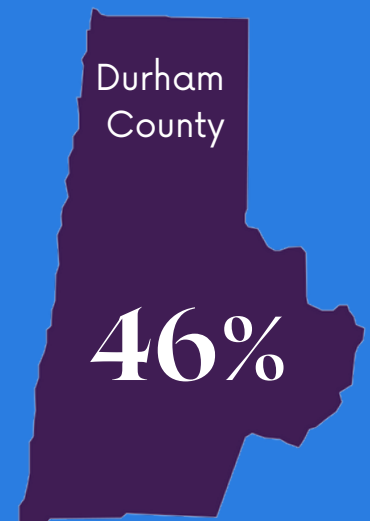
Expanding Our Reach: Impact Across Communities

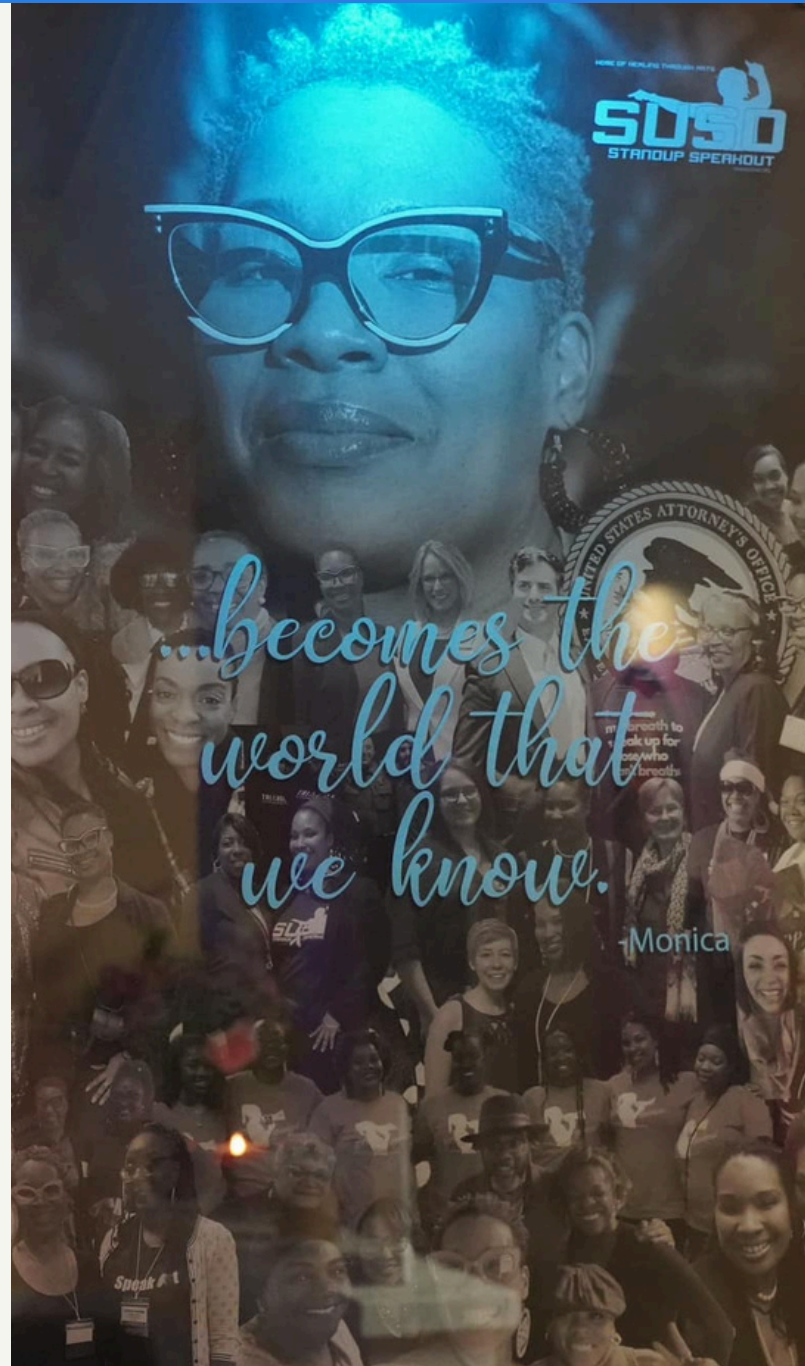
