Going beyond April for the Prevention of Child Abuse

The most important cause that we support as Exchangites is the Prevention of Child Abuse.

With April fast approaching, it is time for our clubs to plan their projects and activities for Prevention of Child Abuse Month.

Exchange has long understood that healthy and strong families are the key for robust communities. We have always realized that prevention makes a difference.

Research shows when parents have strategies and understandings of child development, social support, and resources that meet their needs—reports to child protective services are greatly

reduced.

However, the need for raising awareness of child abuse is as great as ever. There are many forms of child abuse with neglect accounting for 74% of cases, followed by physical abuse, sexual abuse, and emotional abuse. With our youngest children being the most vulnerable. Infants under the age of one have the highest rate of abuse or neglect.

This is why prevention programs are so vitally important. Parenting education, support services for families, community awareness efforts can make a real difference. Our Exchange clubs have been the leaders in this effort. Through our child abuse prevention centers, community initiatives and campaigns to raise awareness during Child Abuse Prevention Month in April, our members demonstrate our commitment to protecting children

and promoting healthy families.

Here are a few things our clubs can easily do. Host a guest speaker to raise awareness amongst our members, donate books to a local library about good parenting topics and resources, provide Exchange Cares bags to a local shelter or to the police that are filled with items like small blankets, stuffed animals and hygiene items, plant a blue pinwheel garden and pass out blue ribbon pins.

Our clubs are encouraged to organize Blue Mondays and wear blue each Monday in April. Let's get involved!! There is so much we can do and so much we need to do!

In Addition the Exchangite Lifetime Achievement Award. for those members celebrating at least 25-year memberships and significant contributions to their clubs will be recognized. ***PLEASE NOTE:** It is strongly recommended that the nominees for the individual awards attend the District Convention Awards Banquet scheduled for May 16, 2026. It is also strongly recommended that a Club representative be in attendance for the club awards.

District Youth Awards will also be presented for "Youth of the Year" and "A.C.E. of the Year" These nominations are due to the District Awards Committee no later than Wednesday, April 15, 2026. Please use the official nomination forms found on the National Exchange Club Website: www.nationalexchangeclub.org. ***PLEASE NOTE:** The recipients of these awards are required to include a photo (head and shoulders) and must be in attendance at the Lakes & Prairies District Exchange Convention's Youth Awards Luncheon.

AWARDS CRITERIA

EXCHANGITE OF THE YEAR AWARD – This award is given to an individual who has excelled in Exchange during the current 2025-2026 year. It includes efforts in membership, leadership, volunteerism, and active participation in Exchange activities at all levels including District and National.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR AWARD – This award is given to an individual who joined Exchange after July 1, 2024. It is awarded to an individual who has really stepped up to the plate as a NEW Exchangite. This nomination form and award is the one that has changed the most. It is now one year of service and needs to be planning on attending the National Convention.

ALL-AMERICAN VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR – This award is given to an individual for their contributions at the club level in a NON-Leadership role. It is designed to recognize and acknowledge the multiple hours and contributions made toward club projects and programs, including regular attendance at club meetings and events. The nominee should not have served in a Leadership capacity and is considered the worker bee or the backbone of the club.

EXCHANGITE LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD – This award is given to those individuals who have been a member of Exchange for a minimum of 25 years. It is based on the continuous contributions of the individual throughout the 25 plus years and includes all aspects of Exchange: club, district, and national. It is an award designed to recognize the full spectrum of contributions made by our fellow club members.

OUTSTANDING CLUB AWARD – Criteria for this award include, but are not limited to, community service projects, Americanism projects, Youth projects, and Club projects involving Child Abuse Prevention, including all fundraising efforts. Membership growth and retention are also key. The award is a traveling Best Club Banner for your club to display at club meetings and events. The club will retain possession of the banner until the awards ceremony the following year. The club will also receive a gift certificate to the National Exchange Market.

OUTSTANDING CLUB BULLETIN/NEWSLETTER AWARD – Choose five bulletins/newsletters the club has printed between July 1, 2025 and March 15, 2026. Criteria is based on content (does it include specific club information), is it balanced, promotes participation and significant news, and contains the appropriate Exchange logos, readability, and eye appeal. More specific criteria can be found on the National website – www.nationalexchangeclub.org.

OUTSTANDING CLUB FACEBOOK PAGE - Facebook pages will be rated on the content, visual design, functionality and relevance of the posts and outreach results in participation through likes, comments, fundraising results etc.

FOR NATIONAL SUBMISSIONS

Rookie of the Year explanation: 1. Each district may submit one candidate. The candidate must be an active Exchange club member in good standing from a club in good standing; 2. Members will only be eligible to earn this award at their first national convention following their 1-year anniversary; 3. To be recognized as The National Exchange Club Rookie of the Year, the honoree must be present at the National Convention. An effort will be made to determine this confidentially; 4. The award will be based on an application due by June 1st. The application includes applicable criteria and narrative with a maximum of 1200 words.

Exchange Club Member of the Year identifiers: Not Eligible • National board members • National Foundation board members • Volunteer Field Representatives • District board members; Eligible • Past National board members • Past National Foundation board members • Past Volunteer Field Representatives • Past District board members • Club member • Club officer.

Big "E" explanation: 1. Sponsor/build a new club or earn the Silver Club Growth Award; 2. Apply for the Community Awareness Award; 3. Earn the National Service Award; 4. Earn a Club Fundraising Award Patch; 5. Dedicate a Freedom Shrine or sponsor a Field of Honor/Healing Field; 6. Submit a Youth of the Year, or A.C.E of the Year, to the district; 7. Work with the Tunnel to Towers Foundation to house a homeless veteran or contribute to an Exchange National Day of Service; 8. Complete a Prevention of Child Abuse project or community education program related to Exchange's national project.

Outstanding District explanation: 1. Achieves a net increase of two new clubs in the district. * 2. Achieves district membership increase of 4%; 3. At least 75% of clubs in the district earn the National Service Award; 4. Submit a district nominee for National Exchange Club: Member of the Year, Rookie of the Year, Youth of the Year, and A.C.E. of the Year by the award deadline; 5. Ensure the district has at least one website or social media platform and that all website and social media platforms in existence are up to date; 6. Publish an electronic district newsletter at least four times a year. • Prize: A National Exchange Club Yard Sign for each club in the district. * The district's achieving a net increase of four or more new clubs in the district will also earn \$600 to allocate to the district's new club building budget.
