The new year offers real hope for life to return to some sense of normality.



That means meeting in person, doing our usual projects and fundraising in the manner we are used to. However, as good as that may sound, all of those things may still be months away.

For now, we have to deal with the hand we have been dealt. I believe we need to divide the year into two parts. The first six months we really need to focus on retention. The second half of 2021 will be the time to really concentrate on growing our clubs.

I know we can do it. Our Lakes & Prairies District membership since July 1, 2020, is down 13.3%. I must commend two clubs who have actually increased their membership. East Minneapolis is up 2.2% and Waverly 1.6%. That is fantastic work on the

part of those clubs. And several clubs have not had any change in their numbers.

For now, I encourage the board of all clubs to stay in contact with all of their members who have not been as involved as we'd like in the last 12 months. Each Exchange member needs to be aware of their importance to the club and to the local community.

Let's show our appreciation for their efforts. **Please submit your club's nominations to the District Awards Committee no later than Friday, April 30, 2021.** The district winners will be announced at the District Zoom Annual Meeting, Saturday, May 15, with a District Celebration Conference in Omaha, Neb., Oct. 1 & 2, 2021.

The District Awards (described on Page 3) will include "The Exchange Club Member of the Year" (formerly Exchangite of the Year), Rookie of the Year, Outstanding Club, Outstanding Club Bulletin, Outstanding Club Website and Outstanding Club Facebook Page. In addition, Exchange Club Member Hall of Fame Award recognition for those members celebrating at least 25-year memberships and significant contributions to their clubs will be recognized. *PLEASE NOTE: It is strongly recommended that the nominees for the individual awards be in attendance at the District Zoom Annual Meeting May 15th and if possible attendance at the Convention Awards Banquet scheduled for Saturday, Oct. 2, 2021 in Omaha, Neb. It is also strongly recommended that a Club representative be in attendance for the club awards.

District Youth Awards will also be presented for "Youth of the Year" and "A.C.E. of the Year." These nominations are due to the District Awards Committee no later than Friday, April 30, 2021. Please use the official nomination forms found on the National Exchange Club website, <u>www.nationalexchangeclub.org</u>. *PLEASE NOTE: The recipients of these awards are required to include a photo (head and shoulders) and must be in attendance at the Lakes & Prairies District Exchange Zoom Meeting scheduled for Saturday, May 15, 2021.

National Exchange approved a new Youth Award last year called the "Legacy Award." This award is a little different than the other youth awards. It recognizes high school students who are children or grandchildren of an Exchange Club member. Candidates will submit their original applications directly to the National Exchange Club Headquarters and a copy to the District Awards Committee. We will acknowledge our club nominees at the District Zoom Meeting May 15th and the Celebration event Saturday, Oct. 2, 2021. The official nominations form is also located on the National Exchange Club website, www.nationalexchangeclub.org.

AWARDS CRITERIA

EXCHANGE CLUB MEMBER OF THE YEAR AWARD – This award is given to an individual who has excelled in Exchange during the current 2020-2021 year. It includes efforts in membership, leadership, volunteerism and active participation in Exchange activities.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR AWARD – This award is given to an individual who joined Exchange after July 1, 2019. It is awarded to an individual who has really stepped up to the plate as a NEW Exchange Club member. The criteria are the same as for the Exchange Club Member of the Year but must fit within the less than two year membership date parameters.

EXCHANGE CLUB MEMBER HALL OF FAME AWARD – This award is given to those individuals who have been a member of Exchange for a minimum of 25 years. It is based on the contributions of the individual throughout the 25 plus years and includes all aspects of Exchange: club, district, and national. It is a Lifetime Achievement Award designed to recognize your fellow club members.

OUTSTANDING CLUB AWARD – Criteria for this award include, but are not limited to, community service projects, Americanism projects. Youth projects, and club projects involving the Prevention of Child Abuse. It also includes membership growth and retention. The Award is a traveling Best Club banner for your club to display at club meetings and events. The club will retain possession of the banner until the awards ceremony the following year. The club will also receive a Gift Card to the National Exchange Market.

OUTSTANDING CLUB BULLETIN/NEWSLETTER AWARD – Choose five bulletins/newsletters that the club has printed between July 1, 2020 and March 15, 2021. Criteria is based on content; is it balanced, promotes participation and significant news, and contains the appropriate Exchange logos, readability, and eye appeal. More specific criteria can be found on the National website – www.nationalexchangeclub.org.

OUTSTANDING CLUB WEBSITE AWARD – Websites will be rated on the content, structure, visual design, and functionality. It follows much of the same guidelines as the Bulletin/Newsletter award.

OUTSTANDING CLUB FACEBOOK PAGE - Facebook pages will be rated on the content, visual design, functionality of the posts and outreach results in participation through Likes, Comments, Fundraising results, etc.

Newest club in the district earns their first National Service Award

The Exchange Club of the Cedar Valley has earned their first National Service Award.

The Cedar Valley Club is the newest Exchange Club in the Lakes & Prairies District. They were sponsored by the Exchange Club of Waterloo and chartered on May 11, 2020. It holds the distinction of being the first Exchange Club to be chartered via Zoom during the pandemic. The Club currently has 21 active members and meets on a bi-monthly basis at 5:30 p.m. The Club uses a hybid in-person/Zoom meeting format that averages about 16 members per meeting.

Since its charter, the Cedar Valley Club has actively carried out the mission of Exchange to earn its National Service Award in January. Some of the activities include: promoting the "Get Out the Vote" campaign; recognizing top cadet graduates from the Hawkeye Regional Police Academy classes of 2020; purchasing Baby Safety Kits for at-risk, new mothers; live streaming a "Visit with Santa Claus" for area children; gathering Christmas gifts and supplies for area disadvantaged families; distributing Thanksgiving food boxes; selling U.S. flags for Veteran's Day; participating in the Take-Out Tuesday campaign supporting local restaurants during the pandemic; establishing a Young Citizen of the Month/Young Citizen of the Year program with a local school; assisting with the Waterloo Club's Honor Field project; and establishing a prevention of child abuse speaker series within the community.

HOW TO REPORT PROGRAMS OF SERVICE AND OFFICERS



Did you know that Exchange has a secure database in its Member Resources section with functions allowing clubs to report Programs of Service projects and fundraisers, track projects, and enter/update club officer information?

When Exchange Clubs enter their Programs of Service projects online they open the door to tracking progress toward earning the National Service Award and ensuring accurate recording of their activities.

HOW TO REPORT PROGRAMS OF SERVICE PROJECTS

Entering Programs of Service Projects:

Please note that only a club officer can enter Programs of Service projects.

- 1. Visit NationalExchangeClub.org;
- 2. Log into the Member Resources area;
- Locate the "Manage My Club" option and click 'go' to view club details;
- 4. Proceed to the Programs of Service (POS) tab;
- Select "Add New Program of Service" and enter the details of the project/fundraiser - each project/ fundraiser must be entered individually.

Once a project's details have been submitted, the POS summary will appear on screen.

As of March 3, 2021, three clubs in the Lakes & Prairies District have earned their National Service Award: Cedar Falls, Cedar Valley, and Waverly

RETRIEVING PROGRAMS OF SERVICE REPORTS

- 1. Select the "POS Detail Report";
- 2. Click on the "Report Menu" and select the desired report.

Once the desired report is selected, the report criteria and filters can be used to locate the desired data.

All Exchange Club District officers are given "POS Snapshots" which provide summarized report of all projects entered within their districts, as well as information about Exchange Clubs earning the National Service Award.

HOW TO REPORT CLUB OFFICERS

Club election results should be reported to National Headquarters through the Member Resources section of the website by April 30. Current functionality includes adding new officers, entering term end dates, editing officer information, and updating club address/meeting details.

Submitting Election Results:

Please note that only a current club officer can enter information about new officers.



Any changes that need to be made throughout the year can also be edited in this area of the Member Resources section. Upon entering officers, please ensure the contact information is current.
