Sermon titles and a summary

This month, we explore the Book of Joshua, exhibiting powerful examples of Christian faith. Often considered a New Testament book in the Old Testament, Joshua imparts timeless lessons that inspire trust, obedience, and identity as God's people.

Sunday, August 3rd, 2025

Joshua 1:1-9 — *"Life of Courage"*

The message encourages a "LIFE OF COURAGE" amidst adversity, faith, and obedience, while trusting in God's sovereignty and guidance in our lives. It emphasizes strength in the face of spiritual warfare and the hope of our inheritance (Romans 8:17)—eternal life with God!



Sunday, August 10th, 2025

Joshua 2:8-16 — *"The Thread of REDEMPTION"*

The story of Rahab is a testament to God's unyielding love and grace. It helps us acknowledge God's sovereignty, embrace our identity in Him, and be bold in our faith.

Sunday, August 17th

Joshua 3:1-17 — *"Crossing Rivers of Life"*

We all encounter "rivers" that stand between us and our destinies—be it fear, doubt, life transitions, or obstacles. Just as God prepared the Israelites to cross their river, He prepares us to face the waters of our own lives in our faith Journey.

Sunday, August 24th

Joshua 4: 1-7 — *"Take up your Stone"*

"Taking up your stone" invites us to recognize and remember key moments of growth and resilience in our lives. Like the Israelites who used stones as memorials of God's faithfulness, we can identify experiences that shape our faith and character. These stones symbolize our trials and victories, reminding us of our journey and the support we've received. Embracing these moments helps us reflect, inspire others, and cultivate gratitude for our blessings.

Sunday, August 31st

Joshua 5:1-12— *"Gilgal: New Beginning and Renewal"*

The people of God have traversed the wilderness for forty years, experiencing hardships, loss, and lessons about trust and faith. But now, as they camp at Gilgal, they face not only the physical boundaries of the promised land but also the spiritual boundaries that have defined them.
