Sunday, February 2, 2025

Isaiah 43:18-19 — *“Beyond Yesterday”*

God is always at work in our lives, guiding us to be open to the new opportunities and transformations He has in store for us.

Sunday, February 9th, 2025

Ruth 1:1-11 — *“Where You Go, I Will Go”*

Ruth's choice to accompany Naomi to Bethlehem was a leap of faith that resulted in a new beginning. It is a testimony of how faith can lead to new beginnings, encouraging us to embrace uncertainty with trust in God.

Sunday, February 16th

Ruth 3:1-18 — *“From Loss to Legacy”*

Ruth's faithful steps transform desolation into redemption, emphasizing the reflective journey of trusting God amidst the dust of Bethlehem, where she became a mother and was counted among the faithful women in Jesus' redemptive story.

Sunday, February 23rd

Ruth 4:1-17 — *“We are witnesses”*

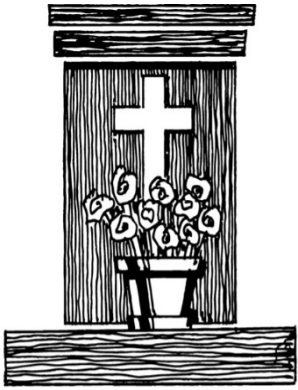
