## CELEBRATING Jesus in the Feasts of the OT—a sermon series

This Lent season, we will be unpacking texts to see how the Jews unknowingly celebrated Jesus in the feasts of the Old Testament. We will utilize Dr. Richard Booker's book, "Celebrating Jesus in the Biblical Feasts," for our study.

### Sunday, March 2nd~ Transfiguration

Exodus 12:1-11— "*The Pass-OVER Feast*"

Understanding the significance of this sacrifice and its fulfillment in Jesus's crucifixion helps us deepen our faith and comprehend God's love and redemption—

### First Sunday in Lent, March 9<sup>th</sup>~

Leviticus 23:6-8— "*The Unleavened Bread*"

The celebration of the Feast of Unleavened Bread is about remembering God's faithfulness and the call to live in a way that reflects that relationship, cleansing oneself from unholy influences, and embracing community.

### Second Sunday in Lent, March 16<sup>th</sup>~

Leviticus 23:9-14 — "*First Fruits*"

The Feast of First fruits is the act of giving back to God before enjoying the full produce of the land reflecting trust in God's continual blessings.

### Third Sunday in Lent, March 23<sup>rd</sup>~

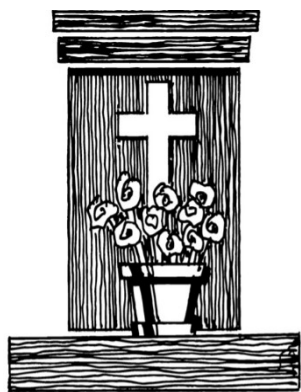
Leviticus 23:15-21— "*Pentecost*"

Pentecost or Shavuot also commemorates the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai. It also represents a covenantal relationship between God and the people of Israel, emphasizing obedience to God's law.

### Fourth Sunday in Lent, March 30<sup>th</sup>~

Leviticus 23:23-25— "*Trumpets*"

Trumpets, also known as Yom Teruah, is a call to repentance, a reminder of God's sovereignty, and an announcement of the coming judgment. It symbolizes awakening and is meant to rouse the people from spiritual complacency.
