

# Sermon Titles—October 2025

*Sermon titles and a summary*

This will be our last month in our “Life of Courage” sermon series through the Book of Joshua. So far, we have uncovered impactful lessons of Christian obedience, resilience, and trust, reflecting our spiritual journey with God. As we move into the conclusion, we see that the promise of God to Israel is fulfilled, and the chosen people rest in the land. This mirrors our faith journey as we persevere and renew our covenants every day (Joshua 24) and rest secure with God.



## Sunday, October 5<sup>th</sup>, 2025

Joshua 11:1- 23 — “Conquerors Through God”

On World Communion Sunday, we see parallels between the Israelites' journey and our global spiritual journey. Just as God empowered them, we too are called to rely on His strength and grace. This day reminds us that, through Christ, we are conquerors over sin, division, and despair. Our collective communion symbolizes God's uniting love, encouraging us to support one another through life's challenges.

## Sunday, October 12<sup>th</sup>, 2025

Joshua 20:1-9 — “The Prefect City Of Refuge”

The cities of refuge offer compassion for those who accidentally cause harm, reflecting God's understanding of human frailty. This concept foreshadows Christ, who provides refuge from sin and judgment. Just as these cities safeguarded the unintentional offender, faith in Christ offers those who believe in Christ protection, grace, and mercy, inviting them into person and transforming relationship.

## Sunday, October 19<sup>th</sup>

Joshua 13:1-15— “Unity in Diversity”

In Joshua 22:1-34, we witness a pivotal moment in the life of the Israelites as they confront the separation of the tribes of Reuben, Gad, and the half-tribe of Manasseh from the rest of Israel. These tribes, having settled on the east side of the Jordan, face the potential for misunderstanding and discord with their fellow Israelites. This passage serves as a reminder of the importance of unity, communication, and fidelity to our shared commitments as Christians and citizens.

## Sunday, October 26<sup>th</sup>

Joshua 24:1-33 “Choose This Day”

Joshua's challenge to “choose whom to serve” underscores the importance of personal commitment in our faith journey. It's not enough to rely on collective belief; each individual must decide. In a world filled with distractions and competing priorities, this chapter invites us to reflect on the choices we make daily.
