

TODAY'S MUSIC: My God, How Wonderful Thou Art (today's offertory) was written by Frederick W. Faber. He had an interesting spiritual journey. He came from a Huguenot and strict Calvinistic family background, was raised and eventually ordained in the Church of England, and influenced by the teaching of John Henry Newman. Faber followed Newman into the Roman Catholic Church six years after his ordination. With his background in hymn-singing churches, he believed that Roman Catholics should sing hymns like those written by John Newton, Charles Wesley, and William Cowper, writing 150 hymns himself. In his first published hymnal he clearly points to the *Olney Hymns* and those of the Wesleys as being the models which for simplicity and intense fervor he would endeavor to emulate.

My God, how wonderful Thou art, Thy majesty how bright, How beautiful Thy mercy seat, in depths of burning light!

How wonderful, how beautiful, the sight of Thee must be, Thine endless wisdom, boundless pow'r, and awful* purity.

No earthly father loves like Thee, no mother e'er so mild, bears and forbears, as Thou hast done with me, Thy sinful child.

* in past usage, "awful" was also used in the sense of ""inspiring awe or fear."
