

Thankfully, we are ending 2021 on an incredibly good note although we are once again grappling with the Pandemic. We are hoping and praying 2022 will be a wonderful year!

It's hard to believe Release & Refresh Women's Empowerment Series, Inc., will be celebrating our Fifth Year Anniversary in 2022! We are excited about this milestone in fulfilling our mission. Of course, we would not be here if it were not for you, our loyal Multiple Year Giving Society and all who have donated and supported RRWES. It is because of you that Women, Girls, and their Families are served with love and on the path of living their best life.

Partnerships

2021 was a momentous year for RRWES as we were blessed to partner with Global Psychological Services, (GPS) an organization that utilizes organizational and educational psychology practices to improve the world of Education. The President/CEO, Mr. Anthony Pendleton, and his amazing wife and RRWES Board Member, Alicia, believed in our mission and personally led our Board through an 8-month visioning and rebranding process. We met monthly to think broadly about our future. As a result, we have a refreshed Logo, rebranded marketing materials all paid by GPS.

Through our Partnership, GPS sub-contracted RRWES to provide Homeless Liaison Services to George Washington Carver Academy a Pre-K-8th Grade school in Highland Park allowing us to hire me as our first employee to provide services to students and their families that allow students to receive the same education other students receive. This has been a rewarding and fulfilling role

as it fits perfectly with our mission of "improving the spiritual and emotional health of Women, Girls and their families. One hundred percent of the Homeless families we serve at GWCA are headed by single mothers who are looking to improve their life.

Because of our partnership and contract, we have hired a young lady to take on the role of Homeless Liaison beginning in January 2022. This will allow me to focus on building our organization including soliciting grants, developing multiple revenue streams, volunteer recruitment including two new board members in which one will be the Board Secretary, program development, and launching our Women's Institute in 2022 which will include a Women's Mentor/Advocate Program to help guide women to improve their quality of life based on the Five Pillars of our Organization:

- 1) Mind
- 2) Body
- 3) Spirit
- 4) Education
- 5) Financial Health

We are designing a specific program tailored to our Homeless Moms.

Liability Insurance

Because of your giving, we are so thrilled and relieved that RRWES and our Board Members are insured. This is something I have been desiring but we were unable to afford it! Now, we can because of your giving and our partnership with GPS! What a blessing!

2021 Programs

We have established a new program called RRWES Helping Hand part of our new Homeless Transitional Services. This service helps provide resources to women in need. We launched a Facebook fundraiser to bless four of our Homeless families with \$100 each to help with their expenses. The federal government defines homeless students as students "who do not have a fixed, regular & adequate nighttime residence."

Our Mentoring program will help and support women to access resources they need to improve their quality of life.

On November 11, 2021, we co-hosted this Spiritual event with Christian Women Connection of Metropolitan Church of God. Over 40 women attended this Praise & Worship, Prayer and Fellowship gathering. Women were delivered, released from bondage, and encouraged! It was an awesome event.

Financial

As you will notice in our financial report, we are so grateful we received funds from the Small Business Administration, part of the COVID relief funds. Many non-profits including RRWES suffered in 2020 because of the pandemic. We were so thankful we were able to get a little boost in our capital.

Finally, we could not accomplish any of this without our founding Members of the RRWES Multiple Year Giving Society and our Board of Directors. Together we are a team, a community with one mission.

I am excited for what the future holds for RRWES and the Women, Girls and Families we will serve in 2022!


