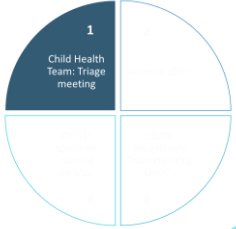

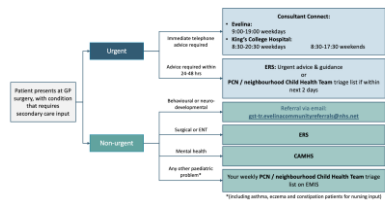
1. Child Health Team: Triage meeting



ATTENDANCE

Patient visits a primary care provider to understand more about their health issue.

REFERRAL

GP refers patient to Local Child Health Team using GP referral template. If you wish for the child to be seen by the Patch Paediatrician, you need to indicate this in the EMIS GP referral template (*this might increase number of children referred to the in-reach clinic leading to longer waiting times*).

CHILD HEALTH TEAM TRIAGE MEETING

Local Child Health Team discusses in detail all clinical queries and referrals, either virtually or in person. This happens on a weekly basis.

RECOMMENDED TREATMENT

The Child Health Team recommend the best treatment for the patient:



Advice and guidance : The triage team make a recommendation to the referring clinician on further management or investigation. This is provided through 'tasks' within EMIS.



Specialist community nursing service: the child is reviewed by a Patch Children's Community Nurse



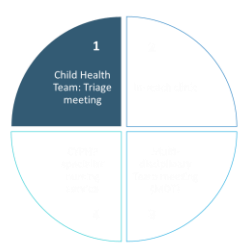
In-reach Clinic: a Patch Paediatrician and GP deliver joint clinic in their local GP practice when possible.



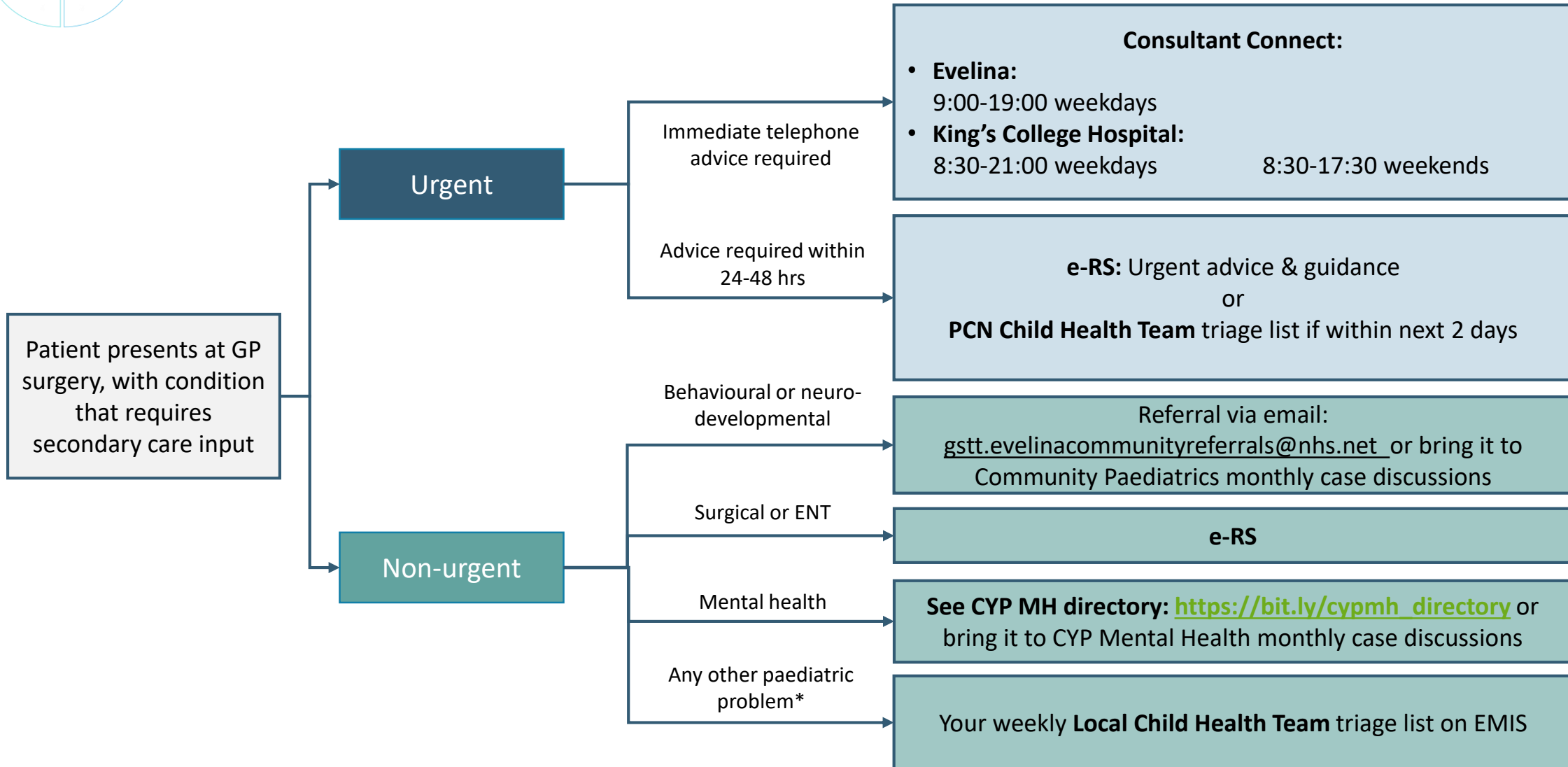
A specialist team: where specialist input is deemed appropriate, the GP is asked to refer on to a specialist team. If possible, the paediatrician will refer on behalf of the GP.



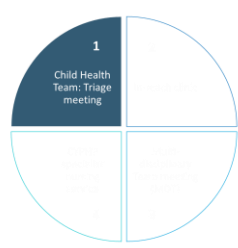
Multi-disciplinary Team meeting (MDT): Complex cases may be reviewed during a monthly MDT discussion and a recommendation provided

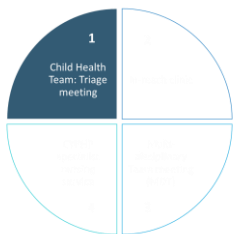

1. Child Health Team: Overview



Each Child Health team includes:



An identified GP CYP lead



A dedicated patch paediatrician



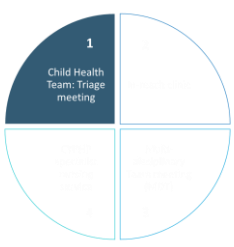
A Patch Children's Community Nurse

Roles and responsibilities of Child Health Team

- Identify local needs, priorities and children who need further support or input
- Support the education and development of the primary care teams to manage children and young people
- Redirect referrals and/ or queries to the most appropriate place or see patients jointly with primary care colleagues
- Involve children, CYP and their families to develop support and services (patient experience and co-production)
- Ensures those that need specialist input are seen by the hospital

The Child Health Team will:

- Meet on a weekly basis to review paediatric referrals
- Ensure that each PCN/Neighbourhood hosts a certain number of clinic slots a month for the Patch Paediatrician to review triaged patients – the 'in-reach' clinic.
- Host a virtual MDT monthly 'lunch and learn' to discuss cases and share learning. All PCN/Neighbourhood and Primary care staff are invited. Anyone referring a patient should attend.



1. Child Health Team: Key roles and responsibilities



GP CYP Lead

- Communicates effectively with all GPs and healthcare professionals within the designated PCN(s) regarding role as principal source of advice and guidance regarding CYP
- Ensures any advice and guidance from Patch Paediatrician is fed-back to the referring clinician, understood, carried out and followed up.
- Supports convening of and attendance at MDT with PCN health professionals including Patch Paediatrician, CYP nurse and subsequently extending to wider team including HVs, CAMHS, Early Help etc.
- Promotes development of CYP services within the PCN/Neighbourhood including supporting data collection/audits to inform service development.
- Promotes education and training regarding CYP within the PCN.
- Supports the strategic direction of the CYP team and spreads learning across the wider network whenever possible.



Patch Paediatrician

- Takes a leadership role in working across professional and organisational boundaries, in combination with CYP GP lead and PCN team
- Participates in weekly triage meetings to determine pathways for children
- Manages care of children who need further care e.g. through in-each clinics
- Contributes to MDT educational meeting for wider community MDT
- Builds the skills of the team through facilitating education within the PCN, and shares learning and skills



Patch Children's Community Nurse

- Delivers nursing care and support to children, young people and families
- Contributes to MDT educational meeting for wider community MDT
- Helps coordinate the care of CYP in community, providing care closer to home
- Works in partnership parents/carers and families to provide nursing care and support to meet the individual child's needs



All team members should champion children's health and wellbeing across community, primary and secondary care

1. Child Health Team: Triage meeting

What is it?

Triage meeting is held on a weekly basis.

Attended by the PCN / Neighbourhood Child Health Team: CYP GP Lead, Patch Paediatrician and Patch Children's Community Nurse.

The Child Health Team review general paediatric referrals from local GP practices.

The triage meeting is for all general paediatric referrals, patients invited in for an early intervention, as well as clinical questions from health professionals in the PCN.

The Child Health Team ensures that patients are provided the most appropriate care, and avoids unnecessary hospital referrals.

This referring pathway is also suitable if the GP needs advice within 48hrs and the triage meeting is in the next few days.

Patients are booked onto "Cross organisational slot" on paediatric referral/triage list, using EMIS. Clinical query needs to be added into referred patient's notes by referring GP or use GP referral template.

If you wish for the child to be seen by the Patch Paediatrician, you need to indicate this in the EMIS GP referral template (*this might increase number of children referred to the in-reach clinic leading to longer waiting times*).

Recommended treatment/ outcomes from the triage meeting?

The triage meetings result in the following outcomes:

- Advice & guidance to GPs
- In-reach clinic
- Referral to a specialist team
- Patch Children's Community Nurse
- Multi-disciplinary team meeting (MDT)

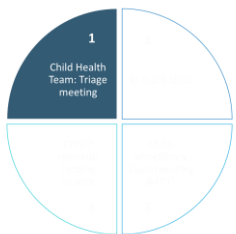
The Child Health Team will write a plan in EMIS, book the patient into an in-reach clinic or suggest onward referral.

The outcome will be sent to the GP and admin support via a 'task' in EMIS.

What outcomes are achieved?

Comparing health service use for the six months before and after children are discussed in triage, there is a:

- **36% reduction** in primary care appointments with a GP or practice nurse
- **27% reduction** in Emergency Department attendances
- **62% reduction** in non-elective admissions to hospital
- **29% reduction** in all paediatric outpatient appointments



1. Child Health Team: Triage meeting

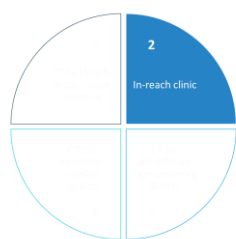

2. In-reach clinic

What is it?

In-reach clinic held on a **4-6 weekly basis**



Led by patch paediatrician.



Attendance by GPs is encouraged for training and education purposes.

Patients are booked onto clinic directly from the Child Health Team Triage meeting, using EMIS.

The in-reach clinic is for patients from all practices within the PCN/Neighbourhood, who have been triaged by the Child Health Team.

Ensures that young people will only be sent to hospital when they really need to be.

What happens after the in-reach clinic?

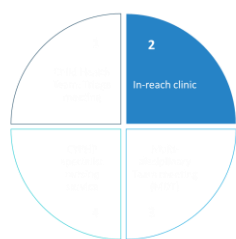
Following the appointment, the paediatrician will write up the notes of the consultation on EMIS and generate a letter to referring GP.

Any actions or outcomes relevant for the referring GP will be allocated as 'tasks' via EMIS, to both the GP and admin.

If the child needs to be referred to a specialist clinic, the paediatrician will do this during the clinic, if possible.

What outcomes are achieved?

Comparing health service use for the six months before and after children are seen in an in-reach clinic, there is a **40% reduction** in primary care appointments with a GP or practice nurse.



2. In-reach clinic

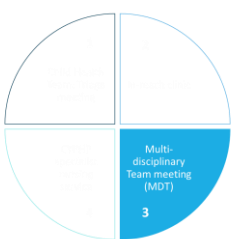

3. Multi-disciplinary Team meeting

What is it?

Monthly MDT meeting, lasting one hour.

Co-ordinated by the CYP GP lead for each PCN, but usually led by the patch paediatrician.

Develops relationships between patch paediatricians and local GPs.

Involves a combination of clinical discussion, review and education.

Clinical reviews: Discuss in detail more complex cases and clinical queries.

Education: Includes shared education and training sessions to help improve primary care knowledge, skills and abilities of GPs in managing CYP in primary care.

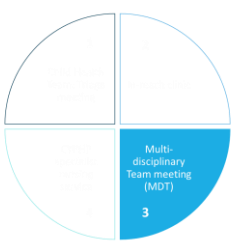
Who can attend?

For all interested GPs and partners in the PCN who care for CYP, such as:

- Child Health Team
- Any interested GP or nurse in primary care
- Health Visitors
- School Nurses
- Mental Health professionals

All GPs within the PCN are encouraged to attend.

Attendance of referrer or nominee requested if their patient is being discussed.



3. Multi-disciplinary Team meeting

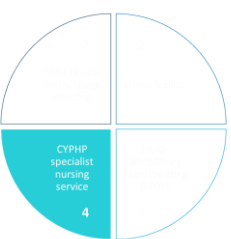

4. Patch Children's Community Nursing service

What is it?

Specialist children's nurses that treat diagnosed conditions (asthma, eczema and constipation).

How the service works

1. Referral

- Active case finding using EMIS call/recall for early intervention
- Patients can self-refer
- Patients can be referred via Child Health Team triage.

2. Health check

All patients fill in a health check online:

www.evelinalondon.nhs.uk/PatchCCN

The health check asks questions about the patient's condition (the child ACT for asthma, POEM for eczema or a constipation questionnaire), as well as broader questions about other factors that might affect the child's physical health, e.g. housing, mental health.

5. Discharge

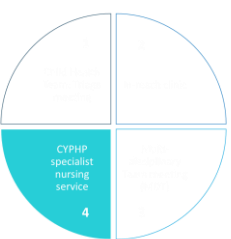
Patients discharged back to primary care, with care plan and notes sent directly to GP

4. Care

All patients are provided with a tailored health pack of information to increase self-management of the condition(s). Patients requiring additional support are invited to attend an assessment with the nursing service, and follow-up / review clinics as required.

3. Triage

The nursing team triage the patient, using information from the health check and EMIS records.



4. Patch Children's Community Nursing service - Outcomes

ECZEMA

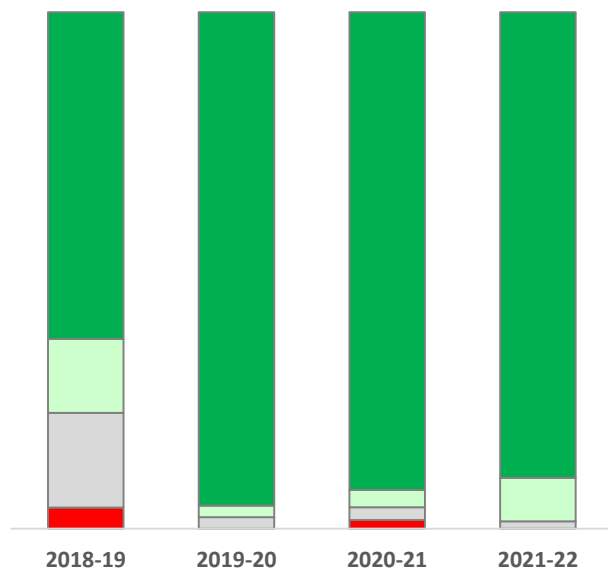
Clinically significant improvement in symptom control

96%

96% of discharged patients had an improved POEm score, when treatment was completed (21/22).

POEm scores:
Improvement for cases where treatment completed

- Worsened 3+ points
- Little change: +2:-2 points
- Improved 3-4 points
- Improved 5+ points



ASTHMA

Reduction in uncontrolled asthma through proactive outreach and treatment

In 2017 **62%** of patients had uncontrolled asthma symptoms at initial assessment...by 2021 this had reduced to **51%**



90% of patients who had uncontrolled asthma at their initial assessment were discharged by the nursing team with reasonably or well controlled asthma, and had a clinically significant improvement in symptom control (an improvement of 3+ points in ACT score).

CONSTIPATION

Reduction in constipation levels



83% of children with constipation levels above threshold when they enter the service, and after 6-10 weeks only 38% still have symptoms above threshold (21/22)

4. Patch Children’s Community Nursing service

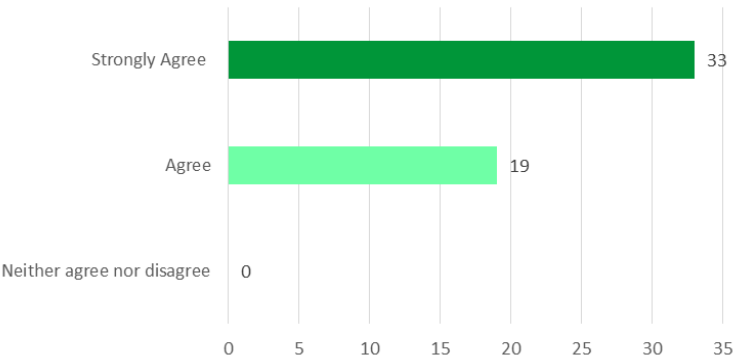

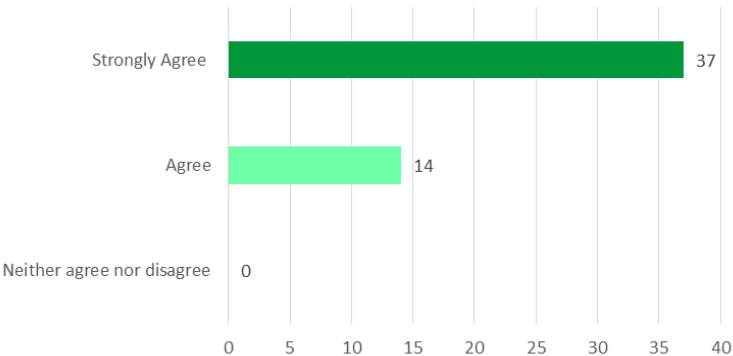

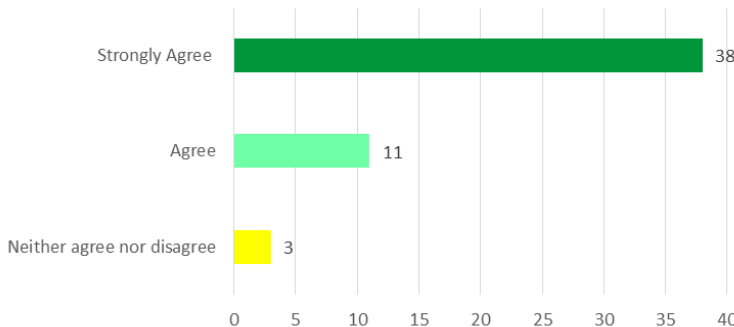
