

Park Road Community Church Lenten Season

<u>Lent Season</u> is a season of fasting and prayer. Lent is a 40-day season (not counting Sundays) marked by repentance, fasting, reflection, and ultimately celebration. The 40-day period represents Christ's time of temptation in the wilderness, where he fasted and where Satan tempted him. Lent asks believers to set aside a time each year for similar fasting, marking an intentional season of focus on Christ's life, ministry, sacrifice, and resurrection.

Park Road Community Church will host Lenten Services on Wednesdays between February 21—March 27, 2024 at Noon. The reference text this year will be <u>ICCC Standing on the Promises: A Devotion and Prayer Booklet</u>

Fasting

"Moreover, when you fast, do not be like the hypocrites, with a sad countenance. For they disfigure their faces that they may appear to men to be fasting. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you do not appear to men to be fasting, but to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly."

Matthew 6:16-18

Fasting is a temporary refusal of something that is in itself good, like food, in order to intensify our expression of need for something greater — namely, a closer relationship with God or a clearer understanding of our purpose and Ministry in the world.

Fasting and prayer are often linked together (Luke 2:37; 5:33). Too often, the focus of fasting is on the lack of food. However, the purpose of fasting is to take our eyes off the things of this world and instead focus on God. Although fasting in Scripture is almost always a fasting from food, there are other ways to fast. Anything you can temporarily give up in order to better focus on God can be considered a fast (1 Corinthians 7:1-5).

Christian fasting is more than denying ourselves food or something else of the flesh - it's a sacrificial before God.

Christian fasting isn't the same thing as dieting, or going on a hunger strike, or punishing our bodies, or fasting for a medical procedure.

Christian fasting is **not**:

- A way to suffer for God
- A spiritual practice that demonstrates a pious act
- Righteousness (i.e. it doesn't equal holiness or sanctification)
- An act of repenting of sin (to repent from sin: we confess it, receive forgiveness, and turn from it)
- Equivalent to an addiction treatment program

If you've never practiced fasting before, try a practical fast. Here are some possibilities:

- Fast from foods associated with "feasting": chocolate, desserts, sodas, coffee/caffeine, alcohol, etc.
- Fast from media or entertainment: cell phone, TV, streaming videos, listening to radio
- Fast from habits and comforts: shopping, online games, social media, following/playing sports, etc.

During this season of Lent, may we take steps toward greater spiritual discipline, spiritual simplicity, spiritual renewal & spiritual growth.

Reflections and Prayer

Week One: Repentance

I John 1:9—10 "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word is not in us.

Prayer

Oh, God, we need your grace continually and we praise you for it. We are ever so thankful for forgiveness and cleaning us from all unrighteousness. So help us to be a people of honest confession on a continual basis, and in this, a people who experience deep grace and walk in your gracious forgiveness and cleansing, as a moment by moment, day-by-day reality. In Jesus Name, Amen.

Week Two: Forgiveness

Mark 11: 25 "And when ye stand praying, forgive, if ye have ought against any: that your Father also which is in heaven may forgive you your trespasses.

Prayer

Forgiving Father please grant me a heart of forgiveness. Lord God, please forgive me for the wrongs I have done to others and grant me greater compassion and a willingness to forgive those who have hurt me. Let my forgiveness be as real as Your forgiveness. In Jesus Name, Amen.

Week Three: Hope

1 Peter 1:3—4 "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By His great mercy He has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, **4** and into an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, reserved in heaven for you,"

Prayer

I am forever grateful because of Jesus' death and resurrection, I now have a *living hope*! Teach us to live with great expectation and remember this priceless inheritance in Christ — an inheritance that is pure and undefiled. In Jesus Name, Amen.

Week Four: Repentance

Matthew 4:17 ... "Repent of your sins and turn to God, for the Kingdom of Heaven is near."

Prayer

Lord God, we confess my sins and repent with sorrow, please forgive me. Allow us to receive a fresh awareness of the severe penalty of sin and how it separates us from You. Our prayer is that Your mighty name is exalted in and through our lives. In Jesus Name, Amen.

Week Five: Forgiveness

Colossians 3:13 "Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye."

Prayer

Forgiving Father please grant me a heart of forgiveness. Lord God, please forgive me for the wrongs I have done to others and grant me greater compassion and a willingness to forgive those who have hurt me. Let my forgiveness be as real as Your forgiveness. In Jesus Name, Amen.

Week Six: Hope

Romans 15:13 "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

Prayer

Lord, thank YOU for being our source of hope. This hope brings joy and peace as we learn to trust YOU completely. May Holy Spirit continue to filter our hearts and minds hope indescribable. In Jesus name I pray, AMEN.
