

The Honorable H. Patrick Stringer, Jr.

Biography

Hon. H. Patrick Stringer, Jr. (Ret.) was an associate judge for the Baltimore County Circuit Court in the Third Judicial Circuit of Maryland. He joined the bench in 2006. Stringer retired in January 2022. 

Prior to joining the bench, he had practiced as a partner at Mudd, Harrison, & Burch since 1986. Stringer joined the firm as an associate in 1982.

He received a B.A. in social and behavioral sciences from Johns Hopkins University in 1974. Stringer then spent the next three years working as a guidance counselor at Calvert Hall College High School (1976 to 1977), a juvenile counselor with the Juvenile Services Administration (1975 to 1976), and a probation officer in the Division of Parole and Probation with the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (1974 to 1975). He went on to complete a J.D. at the University of Baltimore School of Law in 1980.

While a law student, Stringer served as a law clerk to the Hon. J. Harold Grady, Chief Judge of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City (1978 to 1980).

After graduating from law school, he began his legal career as a law clerk and associate in the Law Offices of Edward L. Blanton, Jr. (1980 to 1982).

His memberships have included the Maryland State Bar Association and the Baltimore County Bar Association.

Stringer served as a mentor for the Baltimore City Mayor's Office for Children, Youth and Families and sat on the Board of Trustees of Calvert Hall College High School and the St. Mary's Episcopal Church School Board of Directors.

Stringer was born in Baltimore, Maryland.
